SECRETARY'S REPORT Unfortunately, 1978/79 did not produce the high degree of success for the club that many of us anticipated after last summers encouraging effort. This was due to several factors - not least of which was the loss of some experienced senior players and an entire junior team along with their parents and their coach.

Only the U14s and the thirds qualified for the finals; the other teams ending the season around the middle of their respective premiership tables. The U14s were narrowly defeated in the semi, whilst the thirds didn't even make it that far. This was undoubtedly the major disappointment of the season, for following the teams inspiring performance last season, it was felt that the young players could only build on that achievement. Performances with hat and ball left little to be desired. but unfortunately a number of the boys proved unable to accept the responsibility of playing senior cricket and drew the attention of the umpire once too often. The club may have perhaps been at fault for not providing the team with more experienced leadership on the field - but this is easier said than done. The most disturbing feature of the D2 debacle was that those hardest hit were the responsible players who were caused to suffer for the indiscretions of their teammates. We must be careful to prevent this situation ever arising again.

Des ite some encouraging individual performances, neither the 1sts nor 2nds were able to follow up their success of recent years. Injuries and unavailabilies are of course, unavoidable, but a number of big namesfailed to live up to their reputations, and as Tony points out it may be time for those players to reases their attitudes to the pame and particularly to practice. On the brighter side, the junior XIs fared very well considering the events of last winter. Under David Oswins management the U14s developed into a successful combination held together by some very promising young cricketers. The U16s developed similarly after some early difficulties. The hidden advantage of Kevin Millers pied pipering was that so many boys who would not have otherwise played cricket found a game with our club. Congratulations to all the captains, particularly Tony Chanter who proved himself an admirable A grade skipper, and to all award winners. Richard Stone

'<u>A' GRADE REPORT</u> The First XI did not enjoy a successful season, and I am consequently thankful that I have been requested to keep this report short, as there are very few positive aspects to highlight.

Statistically we finished 7th on the premicrship ladder with 35 points; 6 points and percentage out of the four. It may appear as though we narrowly missed playing in the finals, but no player could possibly admit that our performances throughout the year would have been deserving of such a position.

On a brighter note though, there were a few praiseworthy efforts produced this season. Russell Davison, elected VC at the beginning of the season, was not only an experienced adviser to yself, but again a great exa ple to the team. Due to continual failures by the upper order batsmen, Russ was required to bat 5 or 6 positions higher than he had in previous seasons and yet acquitted himself ad irably. His superb century (without doubt the best innings of the year) in the 2nd round a ainst Canterbury/F.

Trevol Tembs again provided a food season with the ball. He was our top wicket taker with 21 wickets and a best performance of 6/34. Although slower than in previous seasons, Trev still managed to effect many early breakthroughs.

Chris Price, the only newcomer to the team was a very handy acquisition, though unfortunately we did not see quite enough of his talent. Chris was in my opinion the fastest bowler I faced in our competition throughout the year(at one of his rare appearances at training) and it is only his lack of application that prevents him from being a consistent, top line bowler. He could also hit the ball.

Neil Johnston (Iohnno) also indicated in his appearances in the Firsts that he also has the ability and the technique to be an early middle order batsman and a badfieldsman. (Editors note: This must be a printing error.)

I am also told that Rob Walsh, who should probably have pla ed in 'A' grade this year, has improved to the extent that if he can continue his form, must be a starter next season.

Brad Liddle also demonstrated his ability as a cricketer and together with some of the other talented younger play · ers our 'A' grade side should not be short of skill in future years. Ron Blake's return from New Guinea was also a boost to the team. In fact, after Ron's return we did not lose a game, except for the last one against St.Barnabas, in which he did not play. I don't think it was just coincidence.

Unfortunately, attendance and participation at training was poor throughout the season. I thank the players who made a consistent effort to attend and practise. Poor training efforts were in my opinion reflected in our attitude, application and performance on Saturdays. It is impossible to play any sport at any level and expect to perform well without practising the required skills. I am sure that players do at times have trouble attending training, and exceptions can be made. However, I do not believe it is too much for players to find 1 - 2 hours per week to practise. Training, as we all know, is not ideal, but non attendance does not help.

This year, if anything, proved that players cannot cruise through 'A' grade relying only on their natural ability. Lext season we must prove that we are as good as we tell each other we are.

Finally, I would like to thank Richard Stone for the tremendous effort he has again put in for the club. Hany people, including myself are at times critical of Dick for the manner in which he runs things, including training, but the more I look at it, I realised that if Dick didn't do it nobody else would. Dick has a prett nankless task, yet he never complains. I can't imagine that it is too enjoyable having to organise and run training and then remain until last every night to see that all the equipment is packed up; an effort that leaves most of us to shame.

All this adds up to the point that a club doesn't only run on a Saturday, and if our club is going to thrive we must all realise this. The next few years will be make or break years for the club, and if we are going to succeed then we must become involved as a club.

'C1' REPCRT Although we finished only 4 points out of the final four, the seconds completed a rather disappointing season. We suffered from the effects of a rather unsettled team prior to Christmas, but in essence our problems could be attributed to the lack of an experienced, penetrating bowler to replace Ed Irons, and more significantly, to the failure of our batsmen to make runs. Compared with past seasons, our batting performances throughout the year left much to be desired. We were only able to top the 200 twice, in the first and last match respectively. In between we ended too often with scores 100 - 150; not really enough runs for our bowlers to work with.

If team performances on the whole were disappointing, there were on the other hand a number of encouraging individual performances. Robby Walsh continued to develop and improve in all aspects of the game. His Magro efforts in the covers make him a preseason tip for the Brownlow, but his batting - climaxed with a fine 98 against Camb. Salvos - was one of the highlights of the summer. His bowling, as usual, was accurate; his scoring gutsy.

Craig Rowbotham, after a successful season in U/16s and D2 proved a valuable asset to the team. When he put his mind to it, Craig looked a particularly ward bowler to handle. His natural ability with the ball, combined with fine control and a willingness to learn was borne out in a couple of excellent performances - especially his 8/70 off 21 overs against Hartwell. Craig slipped into the number 11 batting spot as if he was born there.

Like Walsh saved his best batting for the last five minutes of the season, but apart from this entertaining effort and a solid 47 early in the season, Like's batting was disappointing. He clearly has the ability to produce W the goods, but must learn to adapt his twilight technique to the two day game. Wal's bowling was at times very effective (6/22 against Trinity) but frequently lacked that extra oite that might come if he were able to put more work in at the nets. On the credit side, Wal's -very presence in the field was at times enough to inspire the younger players to greater heights - not to mention the spectators.

Nike Hill was unfortunately unable to find the kind of form that him such a hit last season, but a couple of solid innings early on, and his fine work in the gully continued to make him a valuable member of the team. David Oswin and Neil Johnston could have been the big success stories of the season in the seconds, but the books were in such a mess in 'A' grade that we saw very little of them or their green biros. Johnno's maiden century in the first round (the only one in the seconds) proved that the leg glance wasn't his only shot after all, while Ossie's solid 40 against Summerhill was another encouraging innings by this rising young star.

Rob Hands produced another useful season in true Rob Hands tr \_\_\_\_\_\_ion. A couple of fine innings under pressure including his first half-century against Trinity, and some remarkable mopping up operations with the ball. Imagine if you can a team being 6/115 and all out for the same total a few minutes later with a bowler capturing 4 wickets in the space of 6 balls to finish with figures of 1.5 overs, 1 maiden, 4 wickets for no runs. Amazing.

Dave Brodtmann finally received his long deserved promotion from the thirds this year, and acquitted himself very well, both as a keeper and a batsman. His finest hour with the bat was undoubtedly against the Barnys when coming in at no.8 Dave top scored with 35 on paddock with grass a foot high. Experts predict a bright future for this lad (so does his mother).

Although Frank Caldwell's batting performances will not exactly win him Sportsman of the Year, they continued to show promise. As soon as Frank finds the middle of his bat those 10s will turn into 20s into 30s etc. If Frank were to spend as much time at practice as he does at the TAB his game would improve dramatically (wanna bet?.)

Glenn Weatherley shaped up well early in the season, showing great potential with the bat, but less strenuous weekend activities soon attracted his attention and he was unfortunately lost to NBMCC. Our loss however, proved to be a great gain for another longstanding local institution, where Glenn easily topped both the aggregate and the average.

Ed 'The Houth' Earl and Greg Stone both had interrupted seasons due to various other committments, but were each able to maintain their established reputations - Greg with a fine fighting innings against Hawthorn Salvos and his brilliant slips catching, and Ed with his sharp barrages of short pitched bowling and stinging sarcasm.

Other notable appearances this year came from Trevor Baxter, Ross Boucher and Chris Byrne whose talents added an extra edge to the teams late season performances. Its a pity Byrney wasn't with us longer. Richard Stone (Capt) D2'REPORT For the third XI, 1978/79 was a successful yet disappointing season with outstanding onfield performances being marred by several foolish and unnecessary incidents which resulted in the team being disqualified by the ESCA FROM PARTICIPATING IN THE FINALS. The team completed the home and away matches 10 points clear at the top of the list, but were of course unable to go on and take out the flag.

Congratulations to those players who co-operated with their captain throughout the season and maintained both the good name of the club and the true spirit of the game. For any player who felt that he did less than this, let it be hoped that the unpleasant experience of the final weeks of the season may have given him something to think about.

After some early experimentation, Lark Pryn was appointed permanent captain - a position not without its difficulties. The continued success of the team justified Mark's selection and if he wasn't quite able to rule with an iron hand, his responsible attitude and consistent batting performances throughout the reason provided an example to the rest of the team.

Due to some fine bowling performances by Steven Buth, Mark Droscher and Rod Towers during the first half of the summer, the thirds managed to produce four successive outright victories and race to an unassailable position on the ladder.

Steve Buth got off to a good start with a hat-trick all bowled - in the first match and followed it up with good performances including a bag of seven in one innings. Steve's unavailability after Christmas was particularly disappointing, and it is hoped that he might be back with us again in the near future.

Mark Droscher, wicketkeeper turned opening bowler, proved very successful with the new ball when he wasn't busy chatting with the umpire, and in one memorable display collected 7/10 (all bowled) against Blackburn Road. Rod Towers, in Letween duckshooting excursions and suspensions also showed a talent with the ball, capturing 6/28 in All Saints second innings.

On the batting side there were some spirited performances from a number of batsmen, resulting in three totals of over 200. The first day of the season was highlighted by the batting of Loss Boucher and Frank Caldwell before he was whisked away to the seconds. Dave Brodtmann averaged around 50 after his first three games and had captured more than a dozen victims behind the stumps before harding the gloves over to Scott Rutherford and joining the men in the seconds. Scott's obvious delight in placing the ball over the fieldsmen's heads prevented him once again from realising his full potential with the bat, but his innings of 59 against All Saints with 5 sixers was OK.

Paul Crump, Barry Hodges and Peter Hiscock each showed some talent with bat or ball, as well as a shared desire to get on with the action. Richard Ludekens 'Tix' came good with a very handy 46 against St Barnabas. Steven Down also produced a couple of good batting and bowling performances, but the surprise packet of the season was undoubtedly Paul Chesterman, whose swashbuckling innings frequently threw the opposition into disarray. Paul finished the summer on a high note with an undefeated 63 against Semi-finalists St.Marks. Kevin Hurley acquitted himself well in the No. 11 batting spot, doing everything a number 11 is expected to do; he had more success however with the ball, capturing 3/4 in only his second bowling spell with NEMCC.

The addition of Brad Liddle to the team after the break helped maintain a high success rate, and he proved once again that he is a bowler capable of success at a much higher level. In onl three matches Brad captured 17 wickets at an average of 4.52. The battingtowards the end of the summer continued to depend on Mark Droscher, Prynney and Ross when the seconds would let him go, but perhaps the highlights of the latter part of the season were provided by U/16 Jim Phillips with a fine 79 and U/14s captain Kevin Wiegel's 55 in the final round. With talert like this on the way up the future looks bright.

Thenks to all the players who attended and assisted at training, and to those who helped transport players, and equipment during the season, and lets hope that next year will see the long awaited NBMCC third XI premiership.

<u>UNDER 16 REPORT</u> After the mass exodus of last year's U/14 team led by the Kerry Packer of Suffolk St. it seemed for a time as though we might be struggling to field an U/16 team for 1978/79, however, with much door knocking and arm twisting we finally managed to produce 8 players for the second round (having been very conveniently granted a bye in the opening round). The fact that only two of the eight had played comp etition cricket before did not worry us unduly - until we saw them in action. Although Davids Hands and Payne had been attracted by the bright lights of the Avenue, Dave Brodtmann sensibly rejected an offer from the liller camp and remained with us where, as captain, his ability and experience was fully respected and appreciated.

As the Leason progressed and word of our enjoyable Saturday mornings spread, the team gradually grew until by the end of March we had 17 players on our list. The season was divided experimentally into separate series of two day matches prior to Christmas and one day fixtures after the break. Such a system suited us well, for although we lacked the necessary talentto successfully contest the longer games, we were as it turned out well suited to the more concentrated one day game, and it was through Feb. and harch that we achieved our best results.

The batting relied heavily on the ability of the skipper to hog the strike, but as the season progressed the pressure on Broddy eased somewhat as Jim Phillips. Gary Christiansen. (ordon Rothnie and Andrew Flynn began to develop confidence and produce useful innings. Jim looked good all glong, but once he straightened out his stance he was even better. Although involved in several matchwiming partnerships with Broddy, Jim's finest effort was in the match against (len Iris when he scored an undefeated 51 to guide us to victory. Jim's keeping was also a great asset. Gordon sometimes had trouble setting bat to ball. but did . manage to produce some useful innings, whilst Golly showed us what he is capable of doing when he scored a brisk 27 against Trinity including 5 fours from 6 balls in one over. Gary Christiansen joined us for the onedayers, and after being frustrated several times by running out of partners. he was finally given the chance in the final when Dave asked him to open with him. In case you haven't heard, Gary made the nost of his opportunity by scoring a powerful unbeaten century. Meanwhile Broddy himself wasn't exactly fiddling around at the other end and also produced his maiden ton. Between the two of them they only needed 18 overs to amass an unbroken opening stand of 236 - narrowly beating our previous U/16 record set by Smithy and Chanter some years back.

On the other hand, there were a few batting lows during the season. The most forgettable performance being our disastrous 36 in the return match against the Avenue on a damp wicket. The sometimes very long tail of our batting order wagged very rarely and achieved some remarkably embarrasing performances. Against Trinity we lost our last 6 wickets for no runs, against Blacky Sth we lost 5 for 3. This sort of thing might have discouraged many teams, but our boys kept coming back for more. In the Avenue disaster we lost 7 for 2, in the return match with Blacky Sth we lost 5 for 7 and so it goes.

Dave Renton, Bruce Hollingsworth, Dean Dipierdomenico (yes, he is related) Mark Osbourhe and Andrew 'Merv' Jetson all looked OK in the nets, but weren't always able to handle the high pressure situation of match play.

Our performances with the ball this year were encouraging. After the first match no team was able to get on top of our attack, despite a number of changes in our bowling lineup. Dave Makrides, Russ Atkinson and Gordon did most of the bowling before Christmas along with the skipper, and each had their moment of glory. Dave Lakrides capturing 4/15 in one game and Gordon 4/52 in another. Broddy proved a versatile and effective bowler all year opening the attack on some occasions and even bowling a bouncer one morning, but it was as a leg spinner that he locked most dangerous capturing 6 wickets on two lucky mornings and looking more promising than Wocca Watkins ever did.
