Editorial

Several incidents of a contreversial nature arose over the winter break, the first being the widely-publicised and much-discussed mass exodus of junior players, led by under 14 manager Kevin Miller. In July the NBMCC committee received a letter signed by eleven fathers of the under 14 players, stating that they were unhappy with the views of the club and the prospects of their sons continuing with North Blackburn Meths. The committee in turn forwarded a letter to each parent suggesting a meeting to discuss in greater detail the problems mentioned in the loriginal letter, but the correspondence ended at that point. The whole affair was marred by a lack of communication and the absence of any direct confrontation between the two parties. The players concerned, from who we heard very little, have been signed up with The Avenue CC, forming an under 16 team, and will no doubt be managed by Kevin Miller.

In August, Blackburn Worth. CC submitted a letter to Nunawading City Council suggesting that full use of both Koonung Reserve ovals be granted to that club. Various vague reasons for this request were included, but a meeting of N.C.C., Blackburn North and North Blackburn Meths. resolved that such a move would be impossible for this season. The possibility of an amalgamation of the two clubs was also suggested, but our committee strongly opposed the idea. No doubt Blackburn Nth.CC will pursue the matter further next season, so we must be prepared to show the N.C.C. that our club is worthy to warrant continued use of Koonung Reserve No.2. This will involve taking care of the ground, the pavilion and not becoming involved in any suspicious activities. (ie. the selling of alcohol without a permit etc.)

Phil Chapman announced his resignation to the committee, ending an eleven year association with North Blackburn Meth.CC. Over this period, he served as an efficient, hard working secretary, a dedicated junior coach and on the field, a valuable all-rounder.

Phil played his first game with the under 16's in 1966/67, (while still an under 14) and finished his career with A grade in last seasons Semi-Final. 101 ret. in the 1976/77 C2 Grand Final was Phil's highest score and in 1969/70 his 7/12 won him one of his many trophies. Phil rates the 1967/68 under 14 and 1976/77 C2 Grand Finals among his most memorable moments with the club. We wish him all the best with his new club, Blackburn Church of Christ.
