#### SECRETARY 'S REPORT

#### TREASURER S REPORT

This seasons financial situation again looked about as bleek as the NCSC's. A operating deficit was recorded for the trading period August 88 to May 89. This was accounted for due to revenue being well down on previous years efforts. By not having the usual beer raffle and the changing social trend of drinking lite ale instead of normal 4.9 stuff the inflow of funds was lowered.

The costs incurred during the season were mainly attributed to ESCDCA affiliation fees, fines, ground rental, pavilion hire, electricity, cricket equipment including pads, gloves, bats, balls, trophies and a set of mats. As a result of a very late purchase of new mats(\$420-) in May, expenses were at a higher level than anticipated.

#### SOCIAL REPORT

The annual golf day was again held at the Chirnside Country Club in mid-february. Due to circumstances beyond his control the organiser arrived late for a change, but just in time to share the longest drive competition with Ken Phillips on the 10th hole. Ossie's shot onto the 12th green neted him the closest to the pin trophy, whilst Handsy blitzed the rather shortish back nine to finish up with the days lowest score.

The double wicket competition attracted some 18 players on a rather hot March afternoon. With the loss of Adair, Tompkins, Richards and Stuart Hackett (½ season) we consistently went into games short of players. With the team spirit that saw us lose just 5 games in the past 2 seasons, we kept our heads high and in round 4 posted our first win against Canterbury/Mont Albert, which was a top performance, particularly the batting of Grant Cameron who proved he could bat well against good bowling, scoring 37, in a 124 run partnership.

The next game against Balwyn, we lost 2 valuable bowlers and ended up bowling all day in 38° heat and with disastrous batting the next week we were lucky to avoid outright defeat. The following game proved to be the most important for the year, after batting first

and setting a reasonable target the clouds opened up 15 minutes before stumps and 10 minutes away from victory. It was by far our best fielding performance of the year and if we won it would have avoided us religation.

After Christmas we won our second game of the year and even Clackers took a catch (first in 15 years) and the way the ladder was we could still make the four if we beat the top 3 sides, this wasn't to be, and we got rolled easy by all 3.

To sum up the year our bowling was just not strong enough, half the time we only had two bowlers, and knew we'd be bowling all day. Also our fielding was poor at times and let the opposition get easy runs. I am sure we can improve next year, hold more catches and concentrate more in the field. Our batting was extremely poor at times especially against Balwyn and also our last three games when we lost concentration far to often.

The good things to come out of this year were the improvement of 4 players in particular.

The first being Athol Kemp who improved his bowling so much on last year, particularly his accuracy and he troubled a lot of batsman. His fielding was excellent at cover. Athol's batting can and will improve in years to come as he proved in the last game when he overcome a lucky start to hit a fine 61 runs. I dig those John Lennon Glasses Baby.

The second Grant Cameron improved immensely throughout the season in all parts of his game. Instead of just averaging double figures as in previous seasons, he averaged 24.33 which was great. Also when needed Grant had several sprints as a wicket keeper and did an excellent job taking 6 catches.

The third Darryl Clark, a vetran player who began his cricket career just before World War II, had probably his best and most consistent season for some 20 years, which was great to see. This 50 year old plus, night club swinger also took his first catch this decade and was never caught short of some stupid corny jokes. Well batted Darryl.

The fourth player Steven Duncan learnt all his cricket at Box Hill indoor cridket centre being one of the legendary "Stembeaters". Joan Jett as he is commonly known played many handy innings and as the season progressed he started playing some nice shots and with a bit more improvement could develop into a good batsman and a handy bowler. DAVID OSWIN dropped himself to the seconds this year and expected to have a big season but the pressure of having poor batting line ups, 8 player sides and the captaincy for a few games, took its toll on the big O. His best performance with the bat against Summerhill Rd was Vintage David Oswin scoring a whirlwind 55 and a very doubtful LBW decision cut short a very high score. Unfortunately for dave he polled a worst on ground performance last game to overtake the very lucky Ross Chamers for the T.F.C. Award. I am sure next season there will be a great improvement.

1988 saw MIKE WALSH (Wal) achieve little on the cricket field because of a broken arm courtesy of his egotisical mate Judgey. But when Michael played after Christmas his experience stood out and he failed to make a score under 12 in the 5 games he played. Remember Wal is the ultimate run machine and foster's lite man.

NATHAN CLARK convinced everybody he is a major shareholder in the "K-Mart Car accessories department" despite being a Myers Pin-Up boy. But coming back to cricket Nathan was woed back to the club and with the pleasure of hearing those familiar catchcrys like "com'on Blackburn knock him over" and "he's only got one shot", Nath had a promising season fielding well, as well as improving his batting and bowling skills. Unfortunately Alex taught him the umpiring rules (say no more Marty). Highlights of the year included that big Sixer and reaching 13 with the bat three times.
