TREASURER'S REPORT

I HAVE PLEASURE IN BEING ABLE TO REPORT THAT AS OF APRIL 1990
WE HAVE APPROXIMATELY \$1100 IN OUR BANK ACCOUNT. BY TAKING INTO
CONSIDERATION THAT WE HAVE UNPAID SUBSCRIPTIONS OF NEARLY \$500,
BY THE START OF NEXT SEASON WE COULD CONSERVATIVELY HAVE \$1400
AVAILABLE IN CASH FUNDS. ADDED TO THIS WE HAVE AN UNUSED SET OF
MATS (VALUED AT \$460.) A DETAILED SUMMARY OF ALL CASH RECEIPTS/
PAYMENTS AND BALANCE SHEET ITEMS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT OUR ANNUAL
MEETING IN ALCUST 1990.

A LARGE PERCENTAGE OF CASH INFLOW THIS YEAR WAS AGAIN CONTRIBUTED BY BEER SALES, HOWEVER TWO NEW FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES HELPED IMMENSELY. AN INCRID HAWKES ORGANISED SHOPPING BUS TOUR RAISED \$230, WHILST AN KATE PHILLIPS LOLLY DRIVE RAISED \$320. THANKS GIRLS. CASH OUTFLOWS FOR THE 1989/90 SEASON CONSISTED MAINLY OF PURCHASES OF REFRESHMENTS, EQUIPMENT, ORICKET BALLS AND TROPHIES. THE EXPENSES INCURRED WERE TO THE NUNAWADING CITY COUNCIL FOR GROUND RENTAL, GAS, ELECTRICITY, AND TO THE E.S.C.D.C.A. FOR THE PRESENTATION NIGHT, AFFILIATION FEES AND FINES.

THANKS MUST BE GIVEN TO ROD HAMES WHO RENDERED HIS TIME IN

ARRANGING REFRESHMENTS AND TO GRANT CAMERON WHO SUPPLIED US CERTAIN

C.U.B. PRODUCTS AT REDUCED PRICE LEVELS.

IN CONCLUSION I WOULD LIKE TO STATE THAT DUE TO MY PLAYING RETIREMENT I WILL ALSO RELINQUISH MY POSITION AS HONORARY TREASURER, A POSITION THAT I HAVE HELD FOR THE PAST FOUR YEARS. THANK YOU.

ON GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP AND ON HOW THE GAME SHOULD BE PLAYED. THE MAN WHO

DOWN, AND THEN HIT THE WINNING RUNS A FEW OVERS LATER. WHAT A HYPOCRIT

ROUND 5 AT MYRTLE PARK AGAINST BALWYN SECONDS SHOULD HAVE PROVED AN ERSY TASK FOR US ON THE REBOUND AND IT LOOKED GOOD WHEN WE HAD THEM 8-98 .UNTIL BIG NICK & RITCHIE CAME TOGETHER AND TOOK THE TOWAL TO173 . THE YEARLY ENCOUNTER AGAINST OID RIVALS C/ M.A. WAS
FIRST UP AFTER THE CHRISTMAS BREAK AT KOONUNG. WE MADE 177 INCLUDING

IMPRESSIVE RUN OUT FROM MARTY (THANKS MATE) ST. SILAS CRUISED PAST US

AND FINISHED AT 303. THERE WERE SEVERAL DROPPED CATCHES BUT ALSO SOME HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDING LOCKY SPITTING IT AND BASHING THE STUMPS, ALEX BANISHED FROM SLIPS AND SENT TO FINE LEG, RACHEL TAKING A CATCH AT MID OFF, BARNESY SPINNING A WEB TO TAKE 4 WICKETS.

GIEN IRIS/EAST KEW/ALL SAINTS WERE OUR NEXT OPPONENTS
AT HOME . BIG AL WAS PROMOTED TO OPENER AND SHOCKED ALL HIS CRITICS BY
MAKING A MAGNIFICENT 64 IN JUST OVER AN HOUR . ERNIE RETURNED TO FORM
WITH 63 , THE IN FORM CLARKY MADE 43 (38 IN BOUNDARIES) THE FORGOTTEN
MAN OF RUNMAKING DICK MADE A SLASHING 38 , FIRST GAMER ROB KENNEDY MADE
AN IMPRESSIVE 12 NOT OUT . FRANK MORRIS HAD A FRIENDLY CHAT WITH THE
NIEGHBOUR . THE OPENING PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN ALEX AND LAX OF 84 AS BOOZE
BUS BULLDOZED AND BAMBOOZIED THE BOWLERS, SET UP A GOOD TALLY OF 271 .
THE SECOND WEEK SAW US BUNDLE OUT THE OPPOSITION FOR 156 WITH GOOD
PERFORMANCES FROM ALL BOWLERS , AGAIN IT WAS BARNESY WHO WAS THE DESTROYER
TAKING THREE WICKETS INCLUDING TWO STUMPINGS BY JIM.

THE FIRST WEEK OF THE GAME AGAINST ST. STEPHENS WAS A LITTLE WET AND PLAY WAS ABOUNDONED AFTER JUST 15 OVERS. A SPORTING DECLARATION AT TEA THE FOLLOWING WEEK LEFT US 199 RUNS TO GET IN 2 HOURS. IMPOSSIBLE? WELL NEARLY. AT STUMPS WE WERE ALL OUT FOR 196 AND OUR CHANCES OF PLAYING IN THE FINALS WERE GONE.

THE LAST GAME AGAINST BLACKY JUNITEDS SLOGGERS SAW A SOLID PERFORMANCE FROM ALL THE BOWLERS WITH GUS AND TAMBO PICKING UP THREE WICKETS EACH AND ROB UNLUCKY IN HIS 16 OVER SPELL. CHASING 248 FOR A WIN WAS MADE ALL THE MORE DIFFICULT BY LAX HAVING HIS BUCKS NIGHT ON THE PREVIOUS EVENING. WE WERE IN TROUBLE AT 5 - 67 UNTIL HANDSY AND GUS PUT ON 86 FOR THE SIXTH WICKET TUPPS MADE 84 GUS 36 AND DICK JUST DIDN'T TURN UP UNTIL WE WERE ALL OUT FOR 178.

IT WAS A DISSAPPOINTING SEASON FOR MOST PLAYERS IN THE SIDE BUT WE ARE ALL GETTING OLDER AND INJURIES ARE HARDER TO SHAKE OFF BUT WE WILL ALL BE BACK NEXT TEAR TO ACHIEVE THAT ULTIMATE GOAL A PREMIERSHIP - WELL MAYBE. THIS SEASON PROVED TO BE A DISAPPOINTMENT, WINNING ONLY THREE GAMES, WITH NO WINS AFTER ROUND 5. WITH REPEATED BATTING COLLAPSES OUR PLAYERS JUST WEREN'T CONCENTRATING ENOUGH, ESPECIALLY EARLY IN THEIR INNINGS. THIS IN TURN PUT PRESSURE ON OUR BOWLERS, WHO DID A FAIRLY GOOD JOB IN MOST CASES.

OUR BEST TWO WINS WERE AGAINST CANTERBURY/MONT ALBERT AND DONCASTER, WHO AFTER BOWLING THEM OUT FOR LOW SCORES WE COLLAPSED BOTH TIMES BEING 5 FOR 15 AND 6 FOR 28 AT STUMPS. TO OUR CREDIT WE FOUGHT BACK AND WON BOTH GAMES, WHICH SHOWED GREAT TEAM SPIRIT.

HOPEFULLY NEXT SEASON WE WILL IMPROVE OUR BATTING AND PUT MORE PRESSURE ON THE OPPOSITION TO GIVE OUR BOWLERS SOMETHING MORE TO BOWL AT.

THE PLAYERS

MIKE JANSEN (CAPT.) – JANNO YET AGAIN DOMINATED THE 2ND X1 AT THE NBMCC. HE BATTED THE MOST TIMES, MADE THE MOST RUNS, HAD THE BEST BATTING AVERAGE, BOWLED THE MOST OVERS (NOTHING TO DO WITH THE CAPTAINCY) AND TOOK THE MOST WICKETS. MIKE EVEN ATTEMPTED TO TAKE THE MOST CATCHES BY TAKING OVER THE WICKET KEEPING GLOVES IN MANY GAMES. YOU JUST CAN'T KEEP THIS MAN OUT OF THE GAME.

For cricket lovers only! Day 1/ Depart Koonung National Park, travel Eram Road past the old Kerrimuir Paddock and west along the creek valley. Pick up Belmore Hwy at Elgar Station, then a steep climb to Union Junction. A detour along the Greythorne Track will lead you to the twin craters of Greythorne State Park. Note the curious convex surface of these unique landforms. Rejoin Belmore Hwy heading for the inland sea to the west. Circle the



western perimeter an<mark>d marv</mark>el at the vast expanse of the Gordon Barnard Basin. This is the site of the infamous tribal war between Locky and the massive Tiggy Taylor and the struggle for possession of the freshwater spring. Continue overland to historic Hislop National Park. Stop to reflect on the past glories of a bygone age - of the time when the Meths struggled with the Deeners and finally regained the premiership trophy after three days of fierce conflict. Drive on carefully through Mahon territory taking care not to provoke the irritable natives. Follow the course of the ancient creek bed and eventually emerge at the eastern tip of MacLeay National Park. This can be dangerous terrain for the newcomer and old hand alike. The hostile Barnys tribe have inhabited this land since the beginning of time and do not take kindly to intruders. Expect the unexpected! Some soft sand driving across the Deepdene Dust Bowl, then pause at the Park office and the Barnys museum and education centre. This is well worth a visit. Refreshments and overnight accommodation are available here. Explore the region on foot, checking out such landmarks as Hunts Hollow, the world famous Parker Point, and Merrill Mound. Don't miss the Scorers Seat with its long and controversial history! Day 2/Head west along the treacherous Langley Track past the Baseball Fence and the ancient corroboree ground with its distinctive red gravel mounds and earth markings. You are now in Myrtle State Park, the subject of much recent media attention. The dense forest which once covered this vast plain has been decimated by the Maddox Multinational group to manufacture souvenir cricket bats for the growing Asian market. See the only surviving examples of the Myrtle paperbark which grow along the western edge of the Park office. Don't miss the unique spectacle of the dog on the thirty metre leash! Rejoin the Highway and then head left at Stradbroke Corner. A long and difficult drive towards Camberwell Junction will eventually reward you with views of the city of Melbourne and on a clear day the light towers at the MCG. Veer off onto Mayston track and stop just short of the old Camberwell Road. Here on your right is a building which has become landmark in the history of World cricket - the Hawthorn Indoor Cricket Centre. The first of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere. For a small fee you can experience the thrill of bowling in a net once used by Penguin & Slug. Talk with the tribal elders about the long distant days of Typhoon Tyson and the "Well bowled, well played" school of coaching. Souvenirs are available. At the end of Day 2 you may return to Koonung via Canterbury and Box Hill, or join our "Yuppy Cricketers Tour" which takes you through the Frog Hollow and

Highfield Regions, ending up at the ancient Basil National Park in the Malvern
