
The song is gone; the dance

lost in an alien tale.


An introduction to the world of the indigenous Australians, considering their traditional lifestyle and culture along with their changing circumstances following European settlement. An outline of black/white relations over the years is provided, from first contact and frontier conflicts through the various phases of separation and assimilation to the eventual granting of land rights. Creative responses by Europeans to the Aboriginal and his situation are discussed, as are the reactions and responses of the native population to invasion and the subsequent plight of their people. The lectures are intended to be presented in conjunction with the film *One Night the Moon*, but could be related to other texts.
