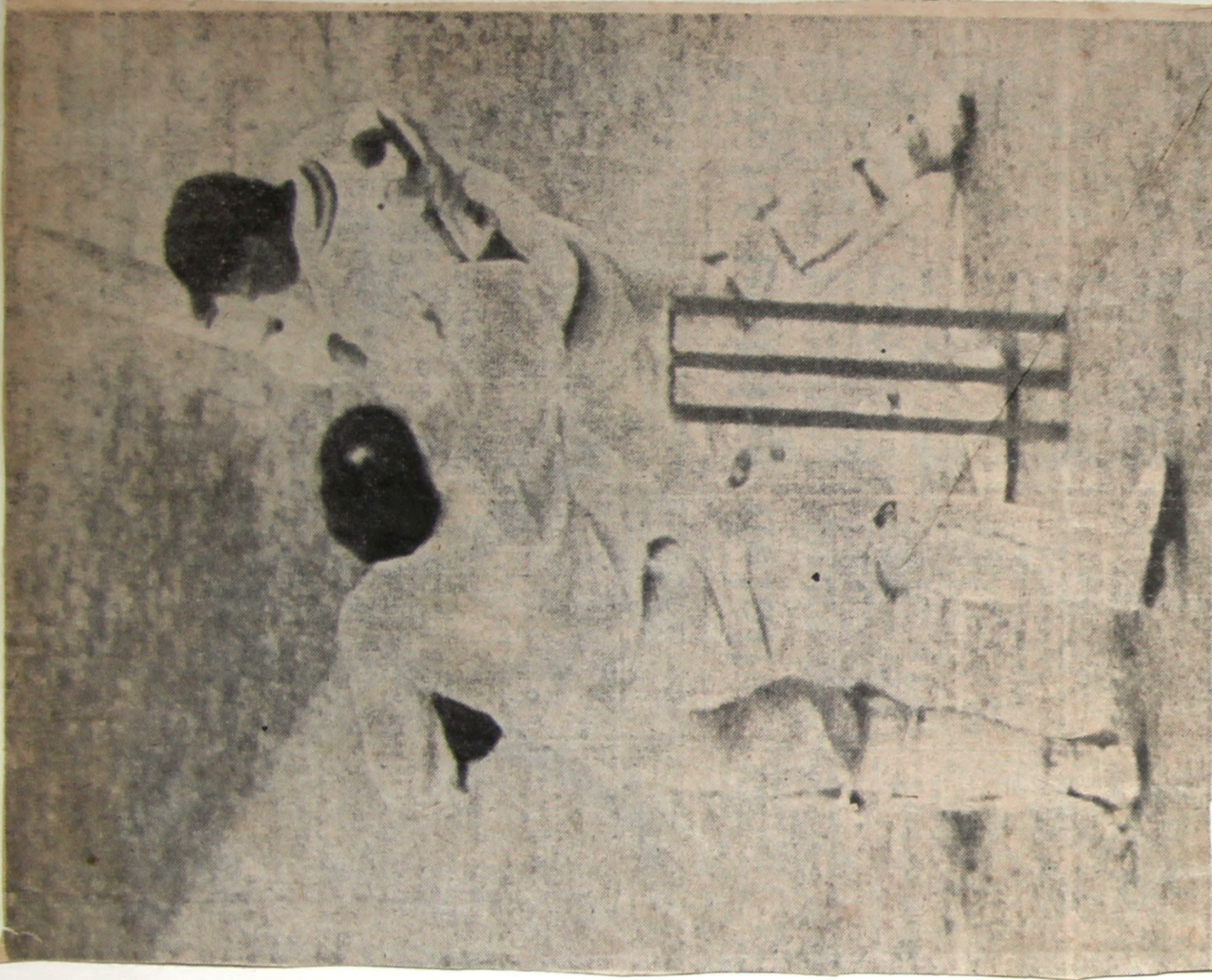

# Redpath to captain State team

IAN REDPATH, 26—

seen in action on right — who had never captained his District team, South Melbourne, until a few weeks ago, will lead the Victorian side at Benalla tomorrow.

The team will play a one-day game against a combined North-Eastern country team, led by Graeme Trewin, 25, of Benalla.

The choice of Redpath is a mild surprise and a big compliment to him by the Victorian selectors.

He has been given the job ahead of another Test player, Bob Cowper, who captained University before becoming captain of his present club, Hawthorn-East Melbourne.

On the Victorian Sheffield Shield team's recent tour to Perth and Adelaide, Cowper was the third tour selector with the captain, Bill Lawry, and vice-captain Jack Potter.

Lawry will go with the team to Benalla, but will not play because of a broken bone in his right foot.

He was hit by a ball while batting for Northcote on Cup Day.

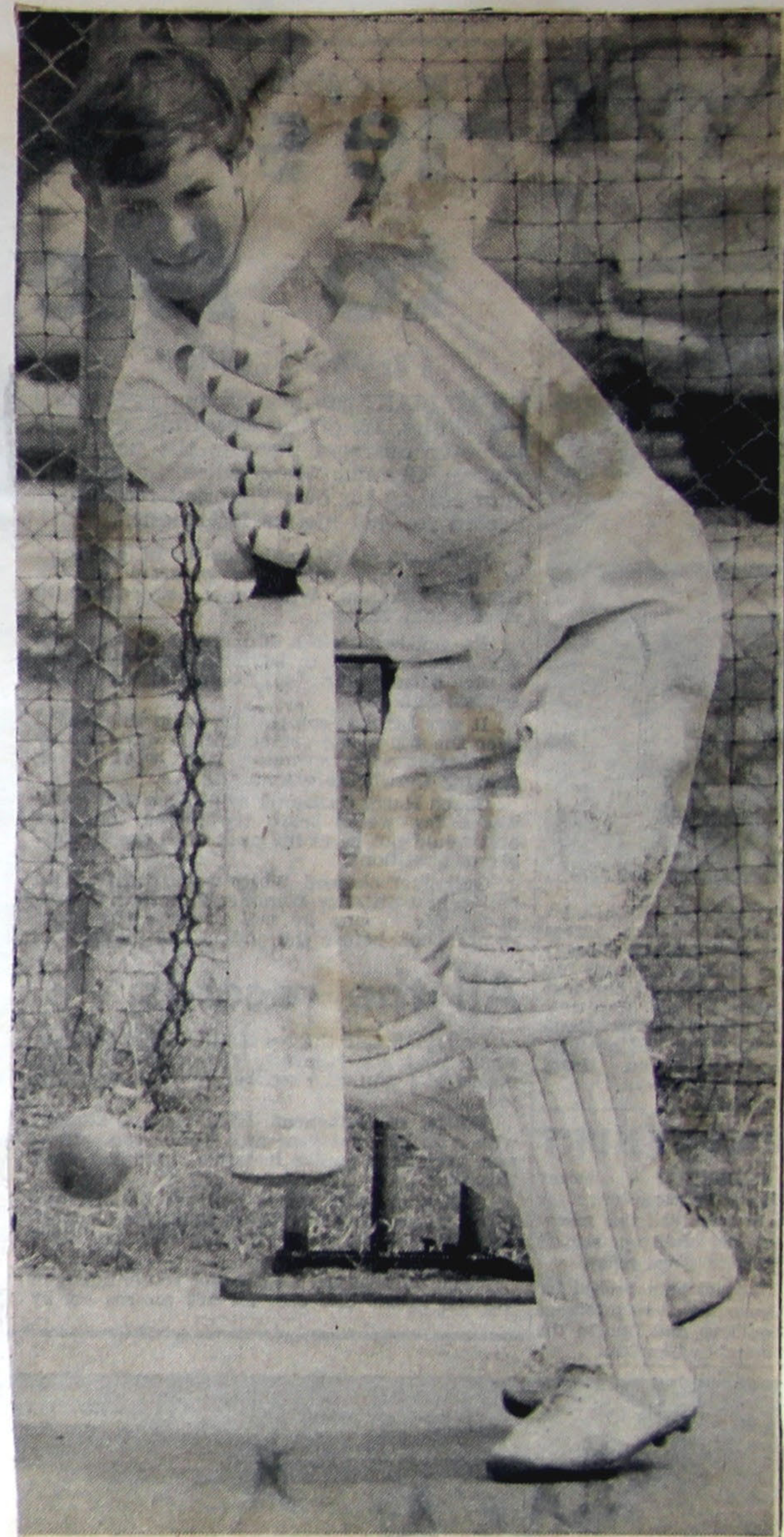
Potter missed selection after playing regularly for 11 years.

Last night one of the selectors said that the team chosen to play at Benalla could be altered for the four-day game against New Zealand starting at the MCG next Friday.

Lawry's selection cannot be confirmed until he has a fitness test, probably on Tuesday or Wednesday.

If Lawry is unfit the selectors obviously will have to consider whether to recall Potter and give him the captaincy or choose another candidate.

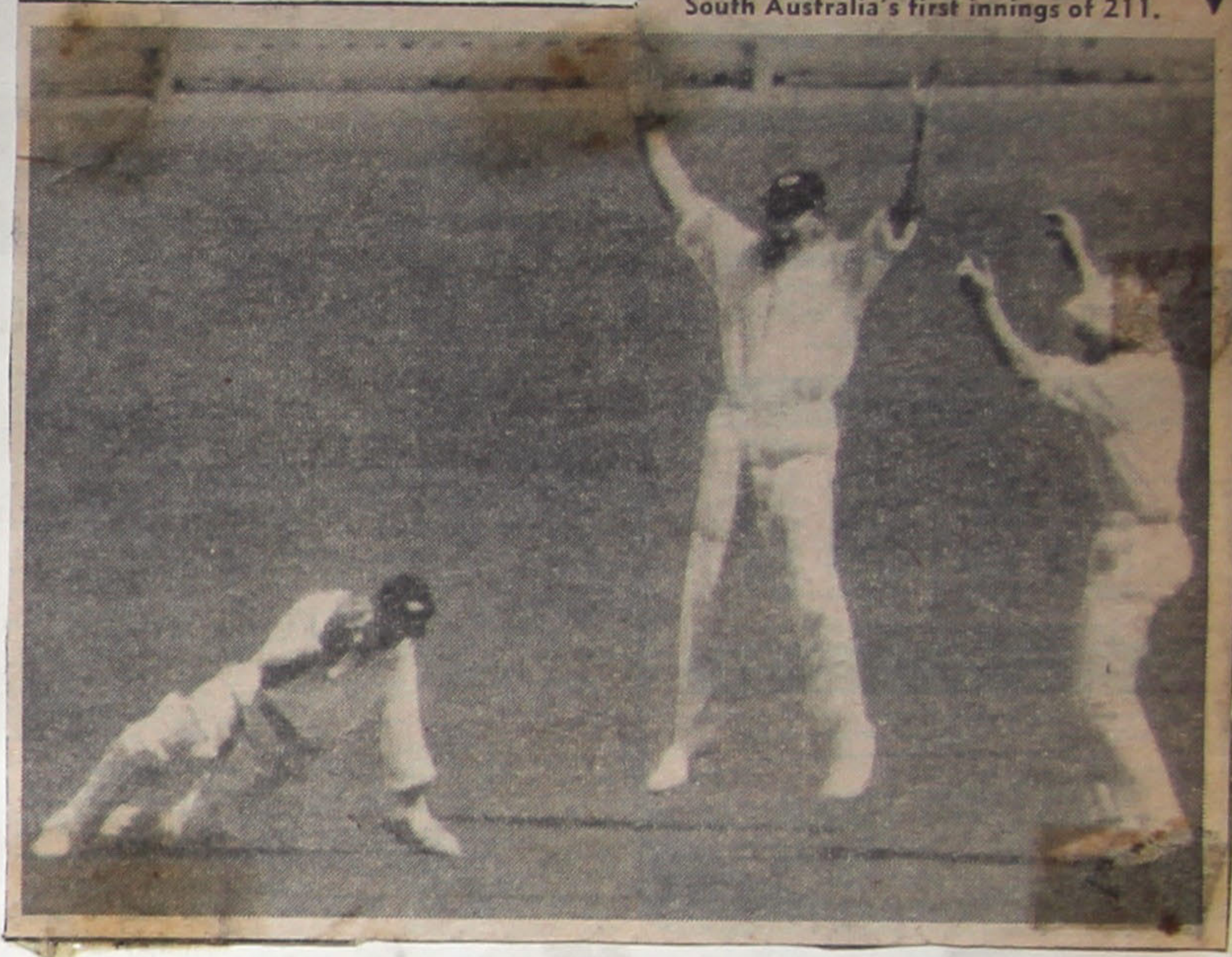

# His spin may be a problem



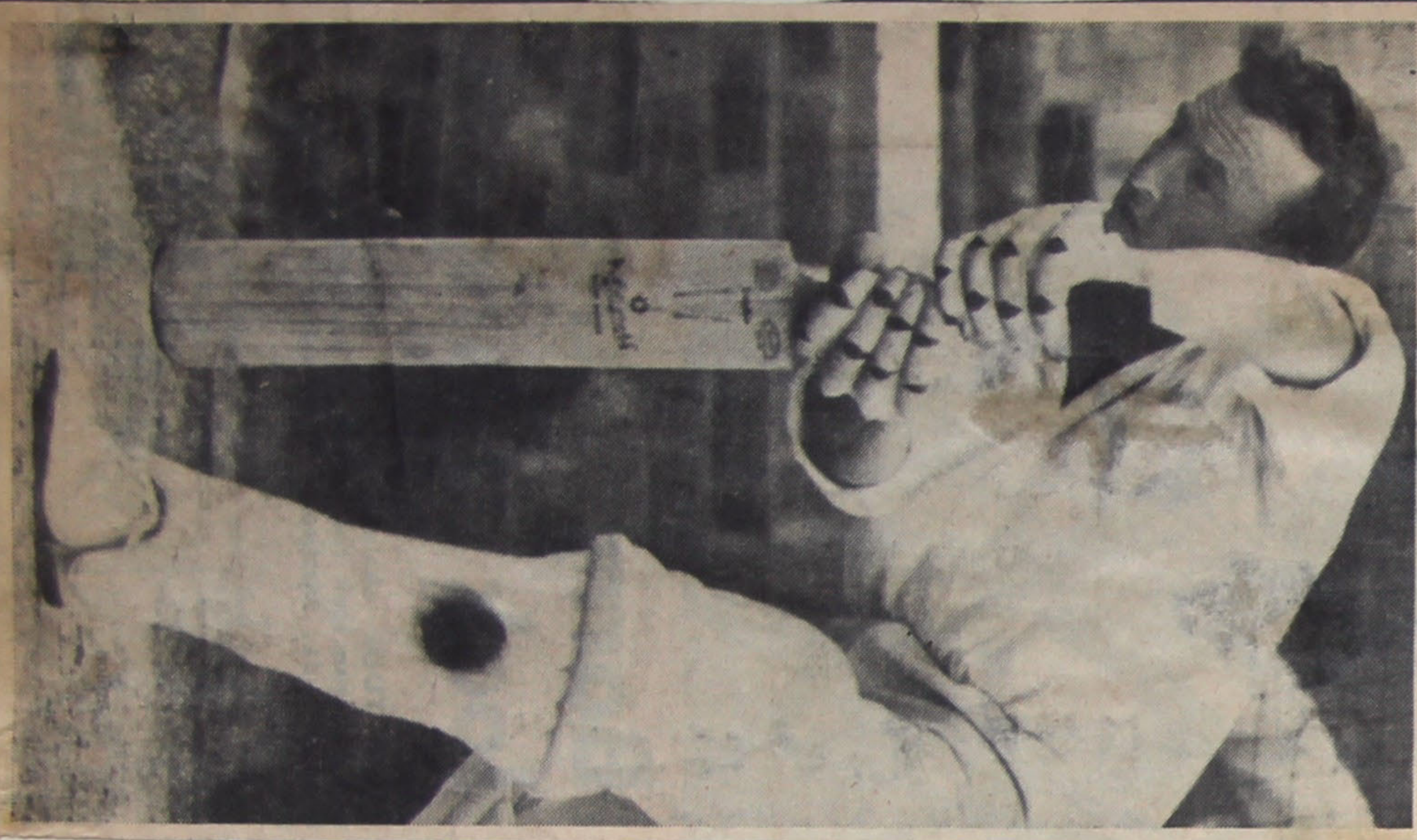
INDIAN spin bowling discovery Bishen Bedi has adapted himself quickly to Australian conditions.

His good early form at the nets indicates that he could present problems for Australian batsmen later in the season. 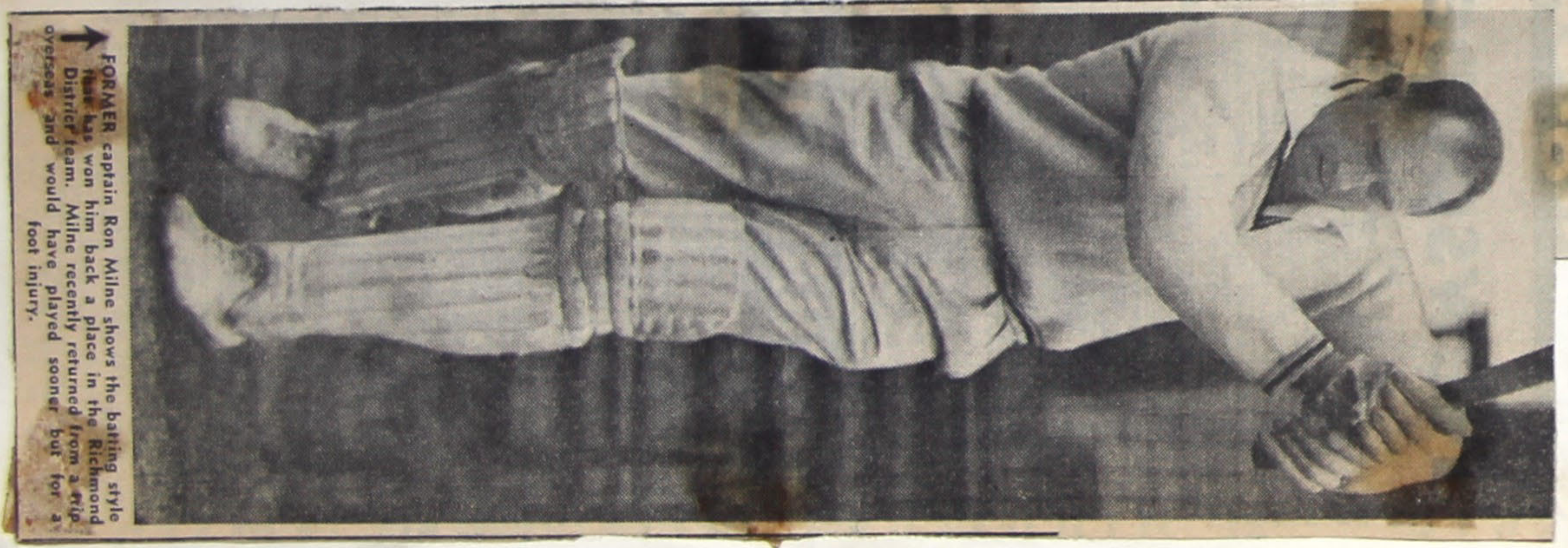
# Getting ready for his big Friday game

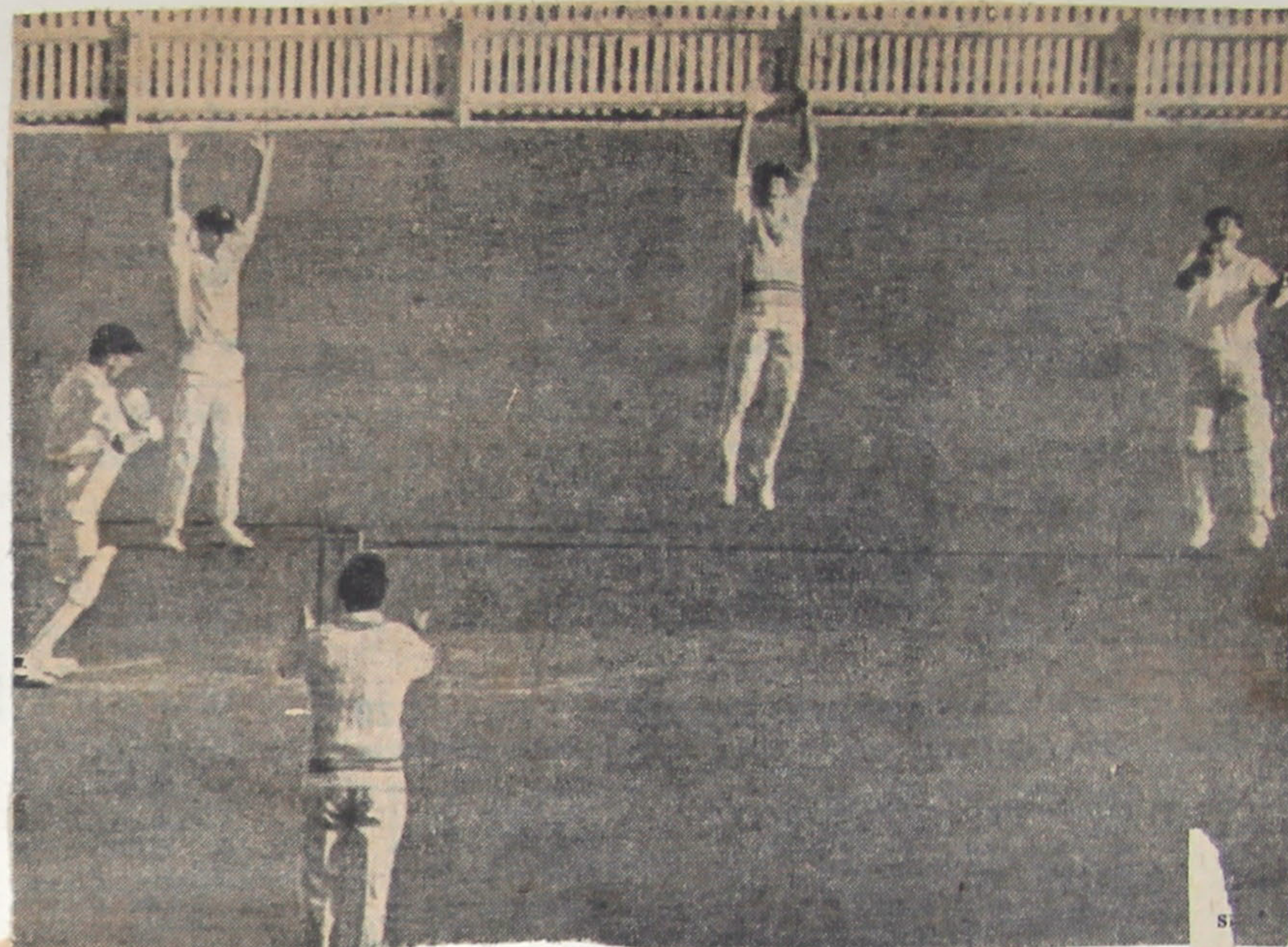

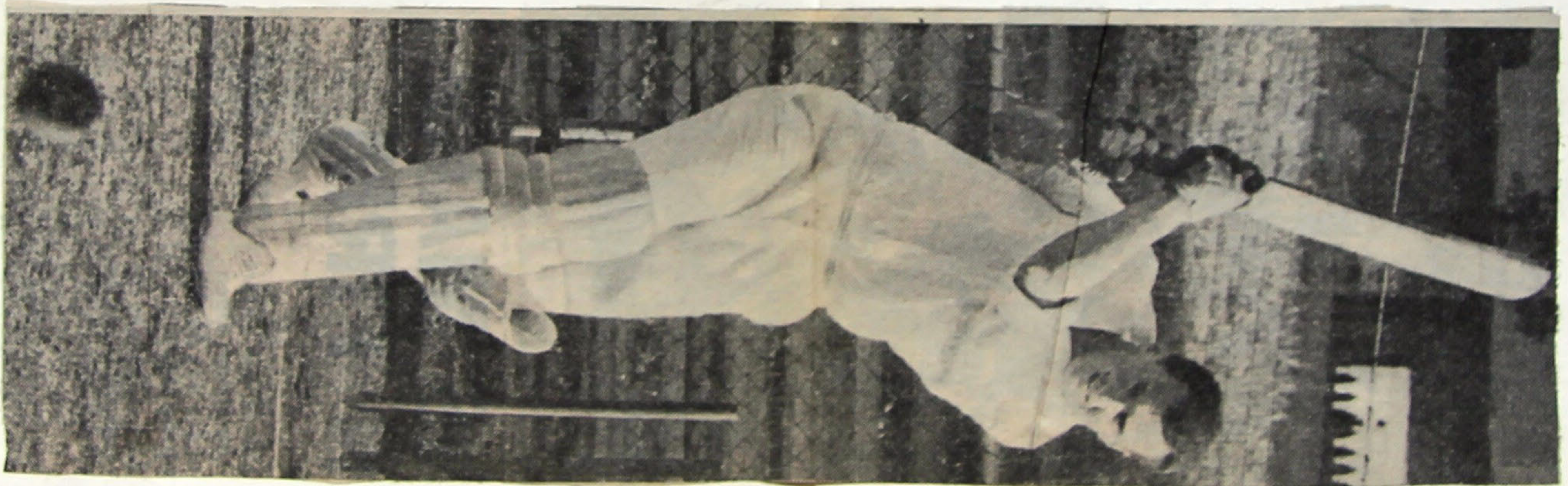

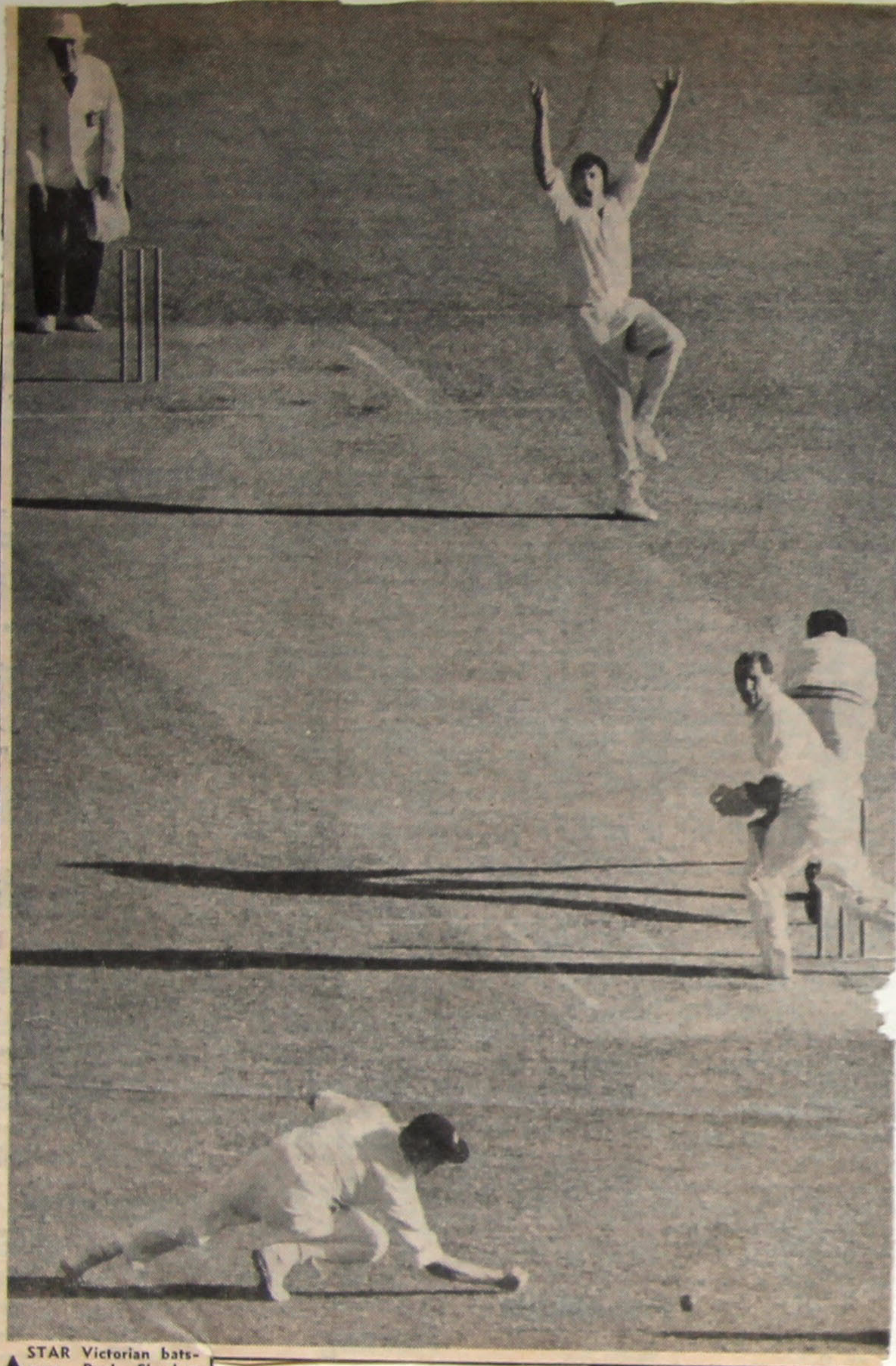

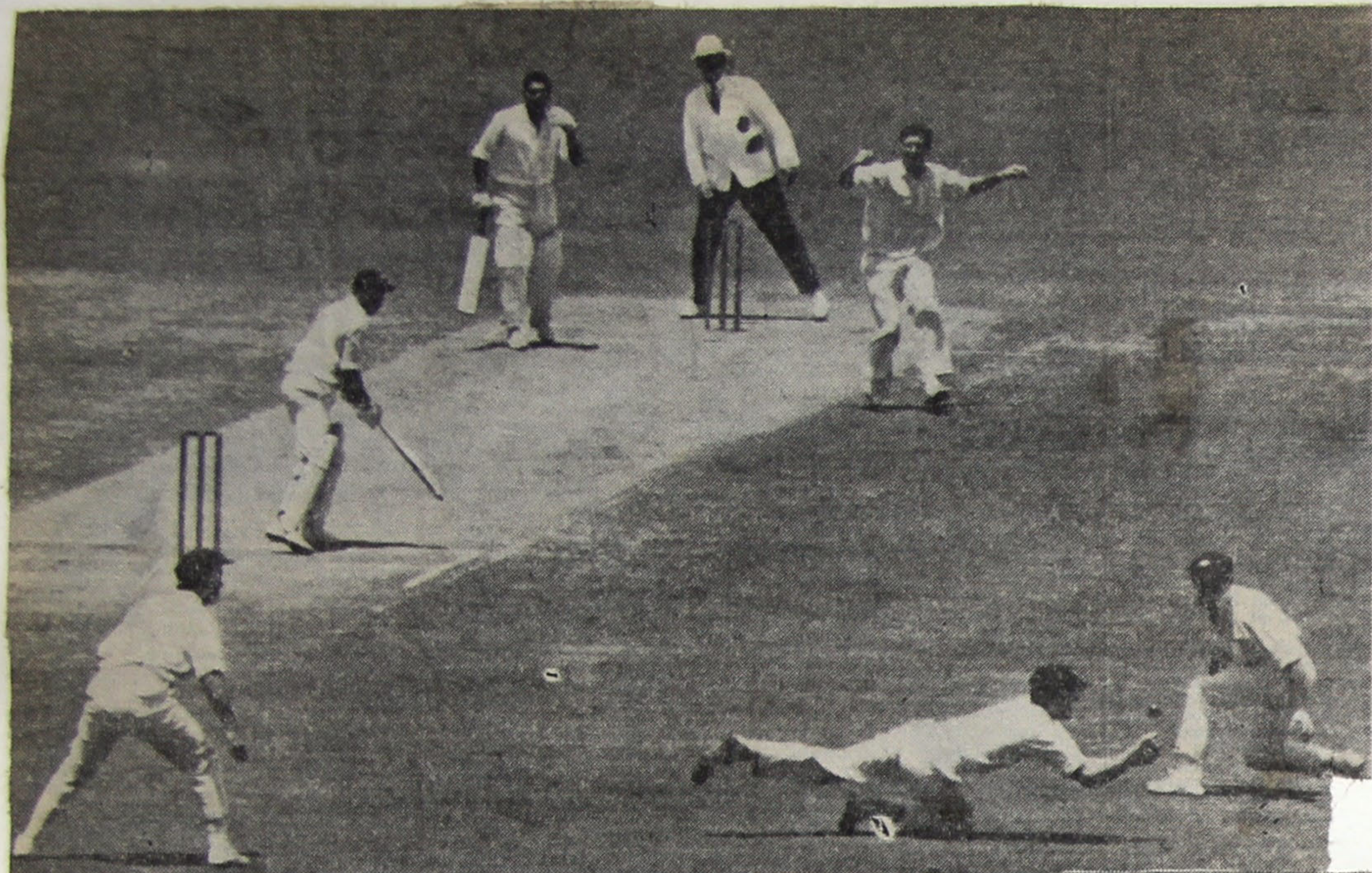

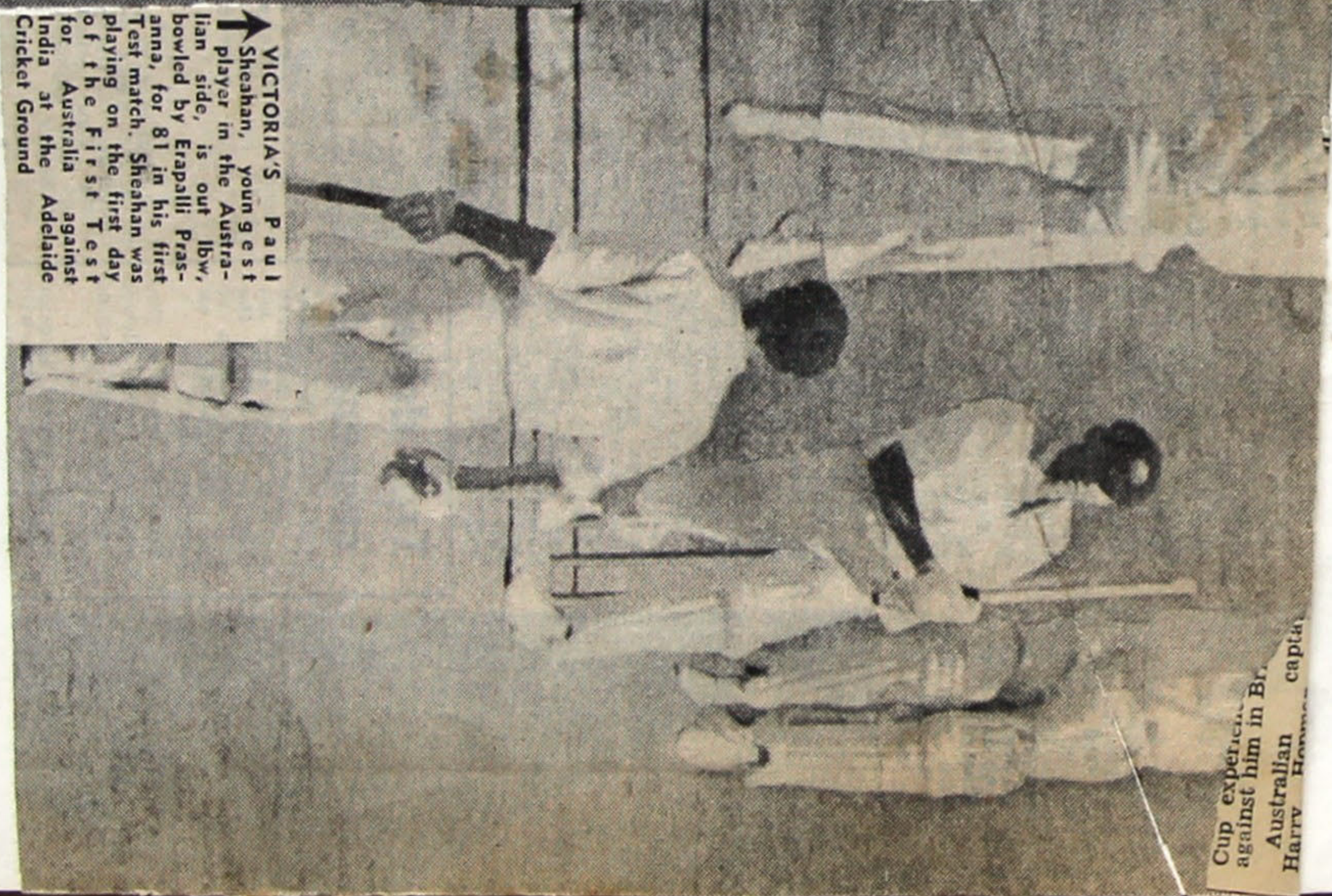

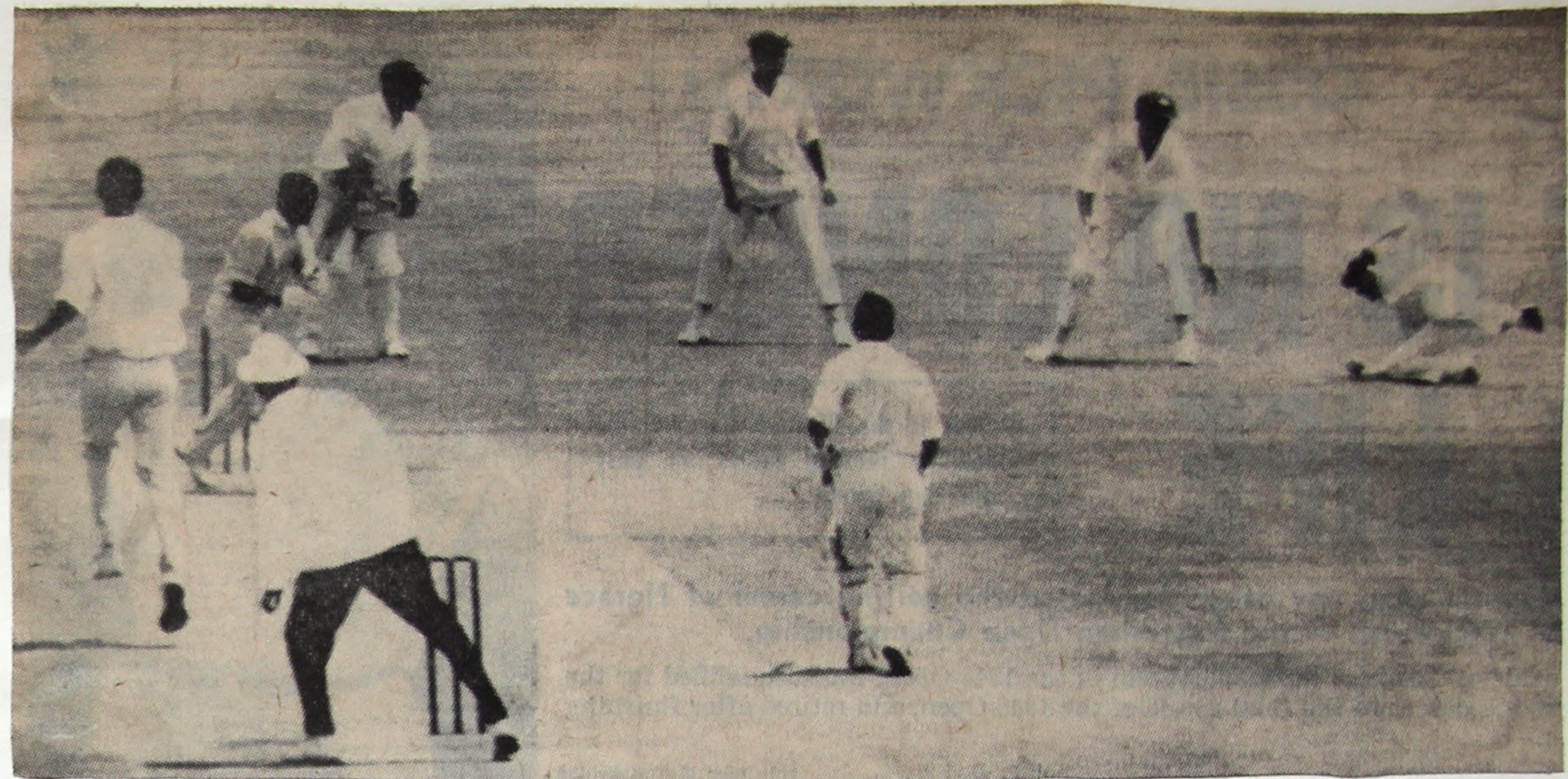

 BELOW: Sheahan, more constructive, pulls Chandrasekhar to the fine leg boundary as he progresses to 81 in Australia's first innings.

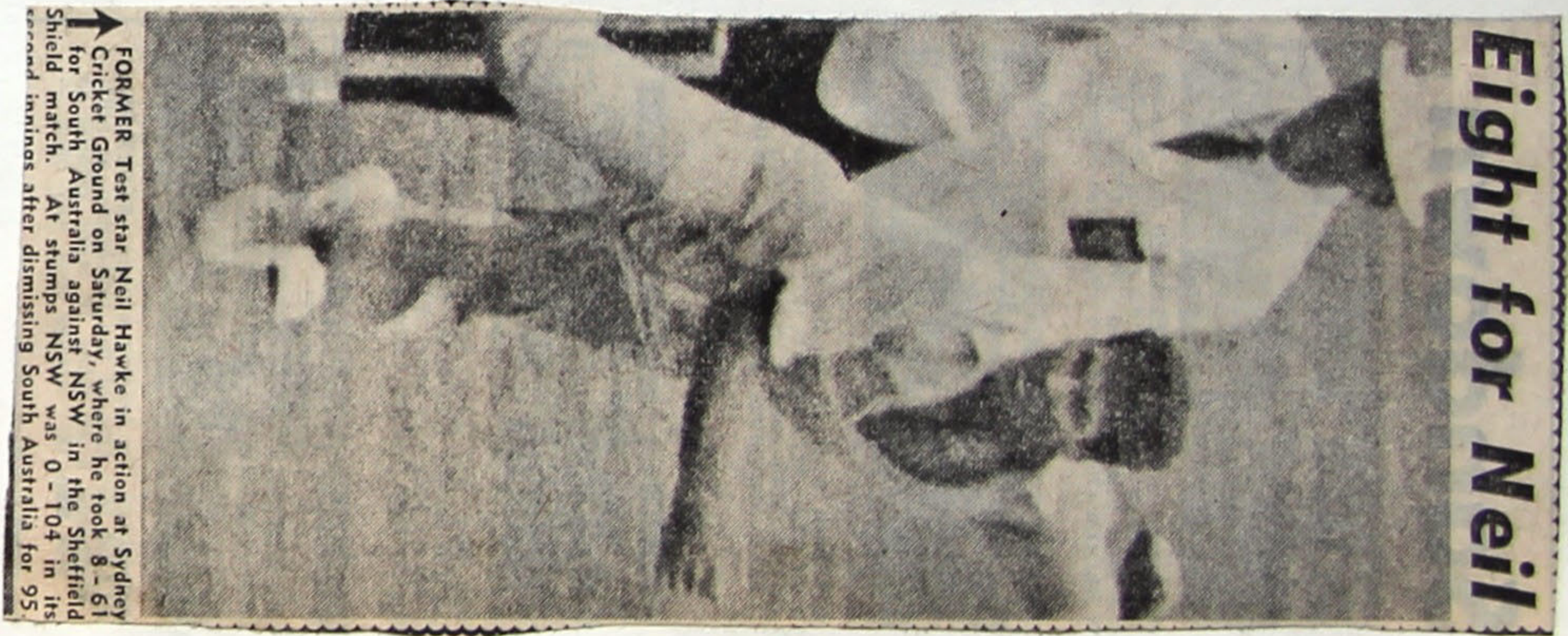

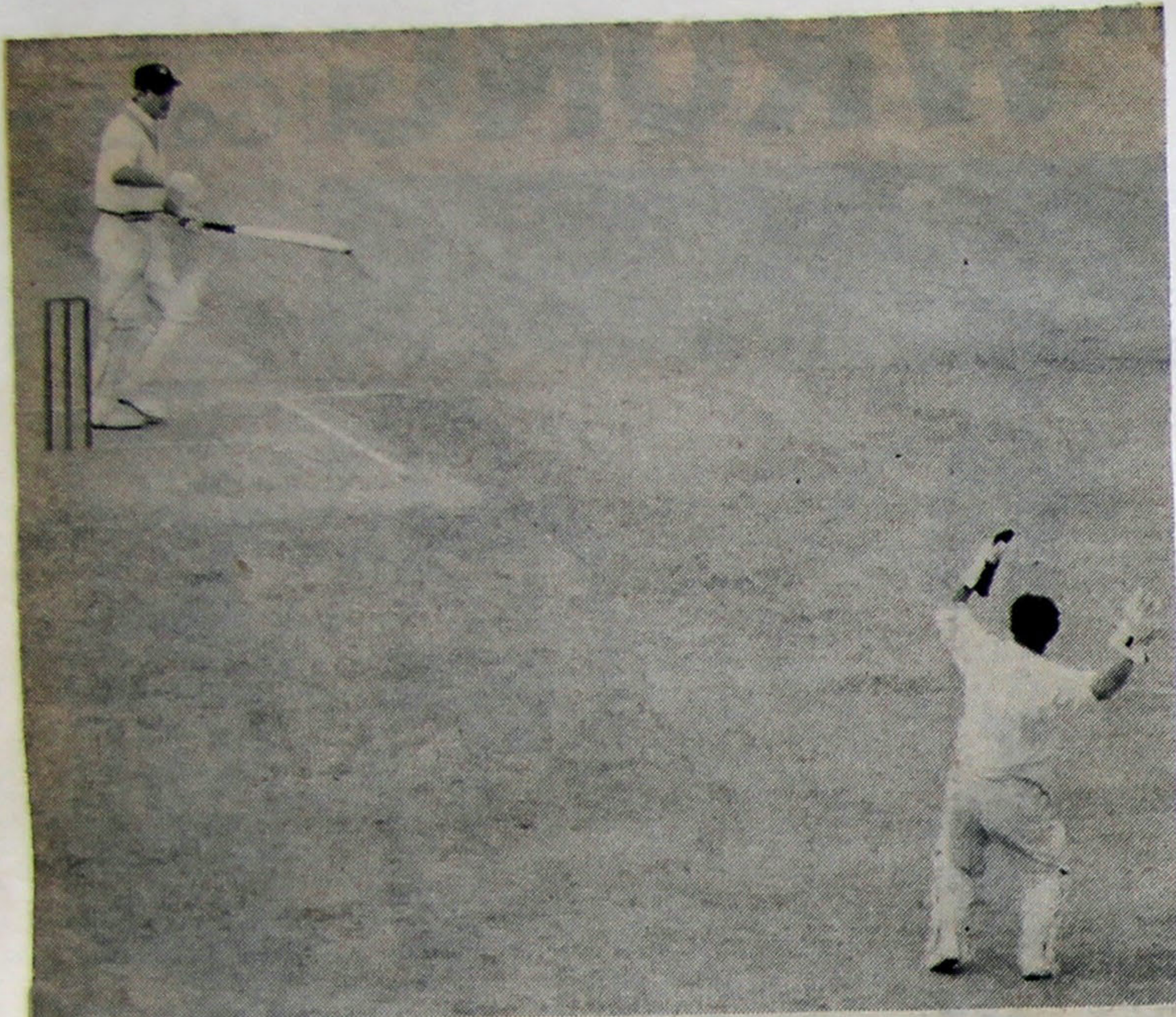

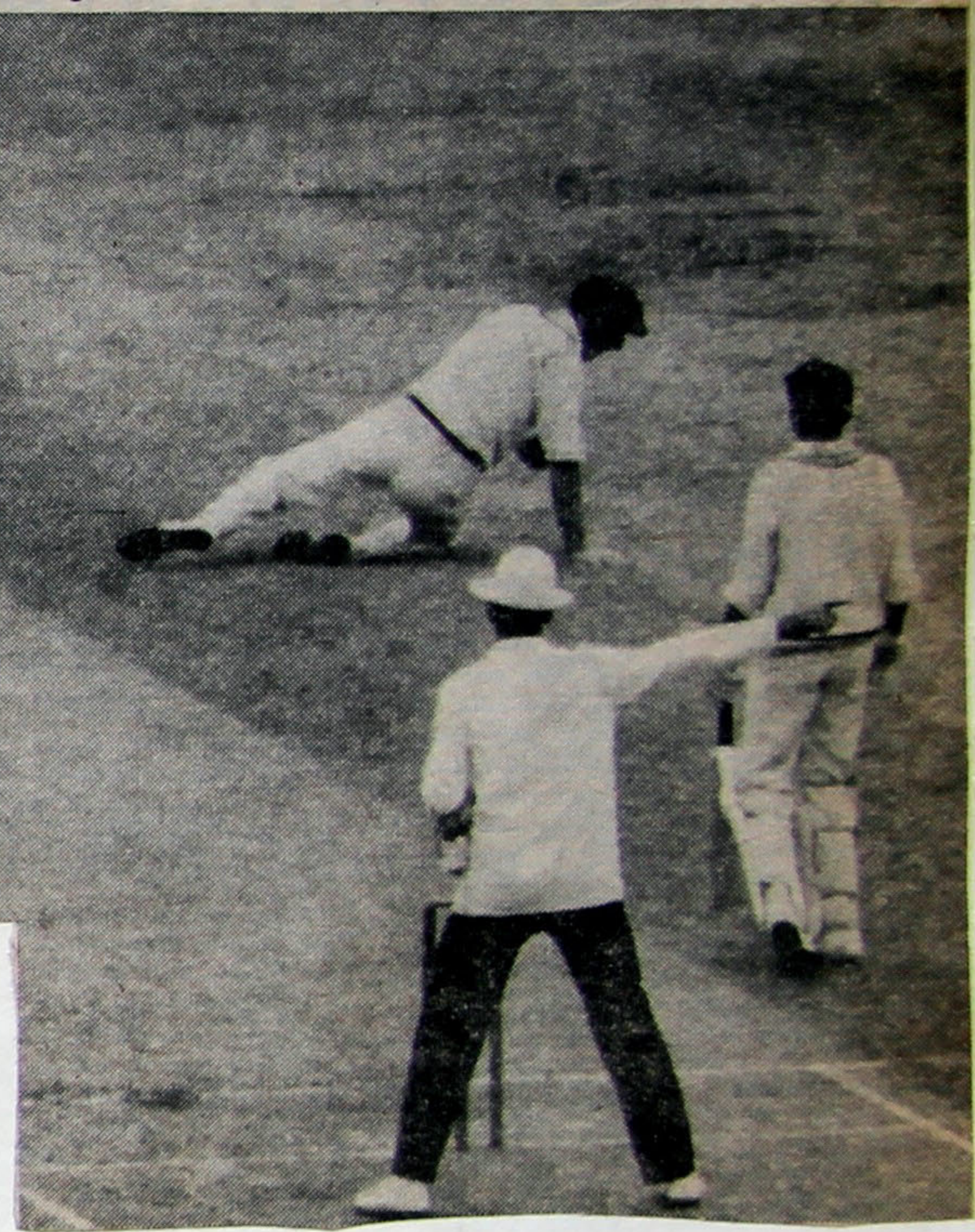

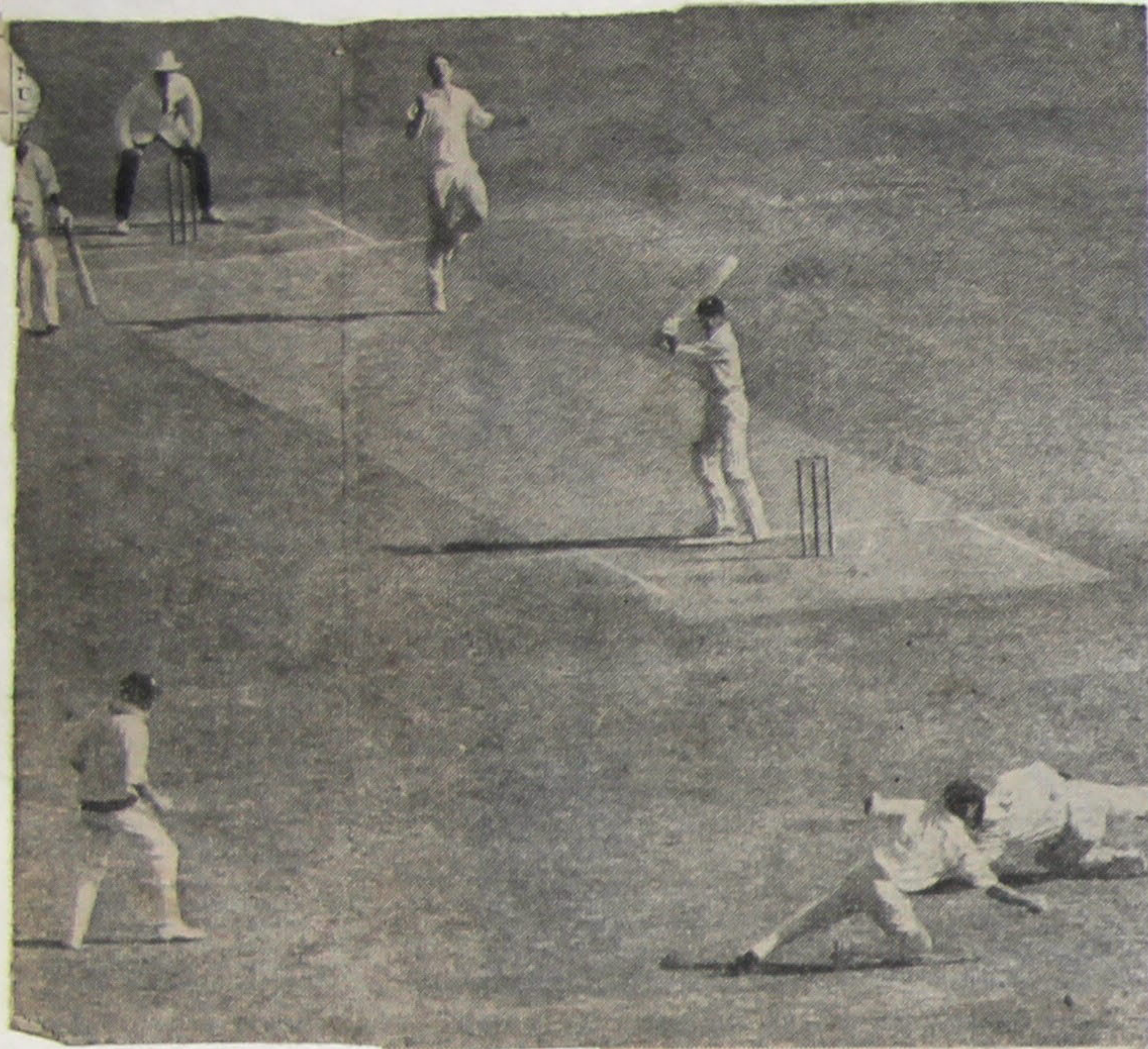

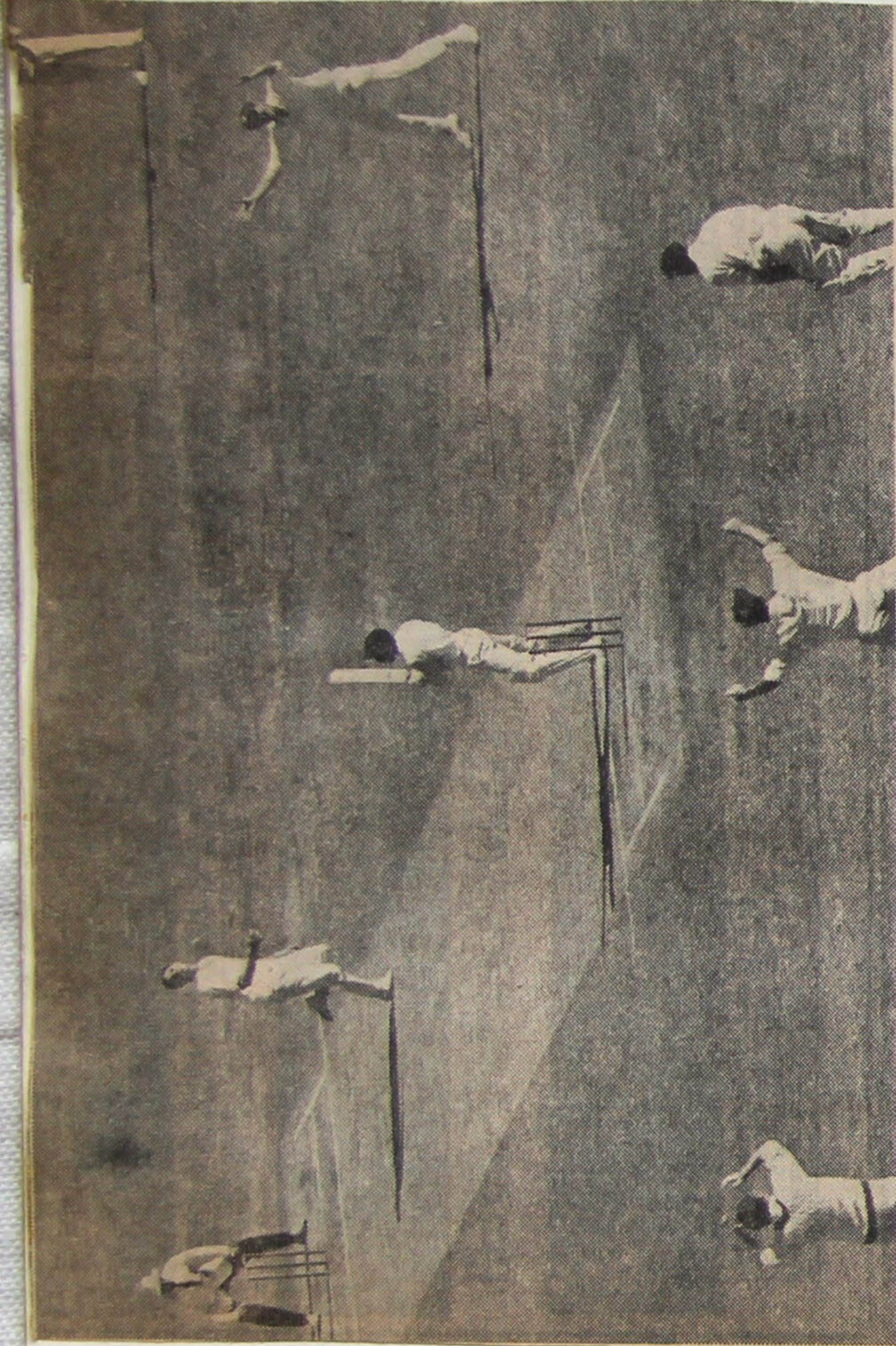

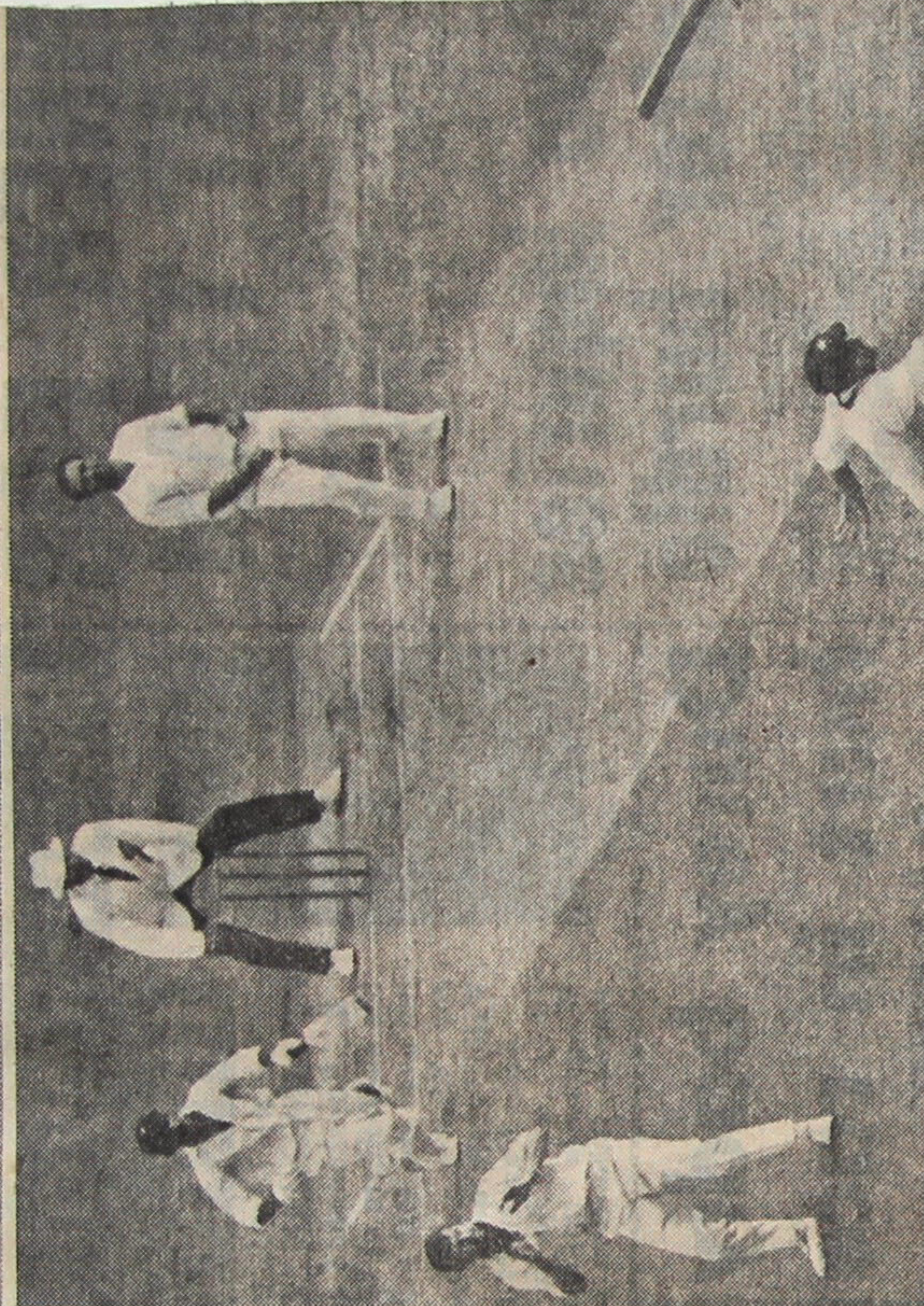

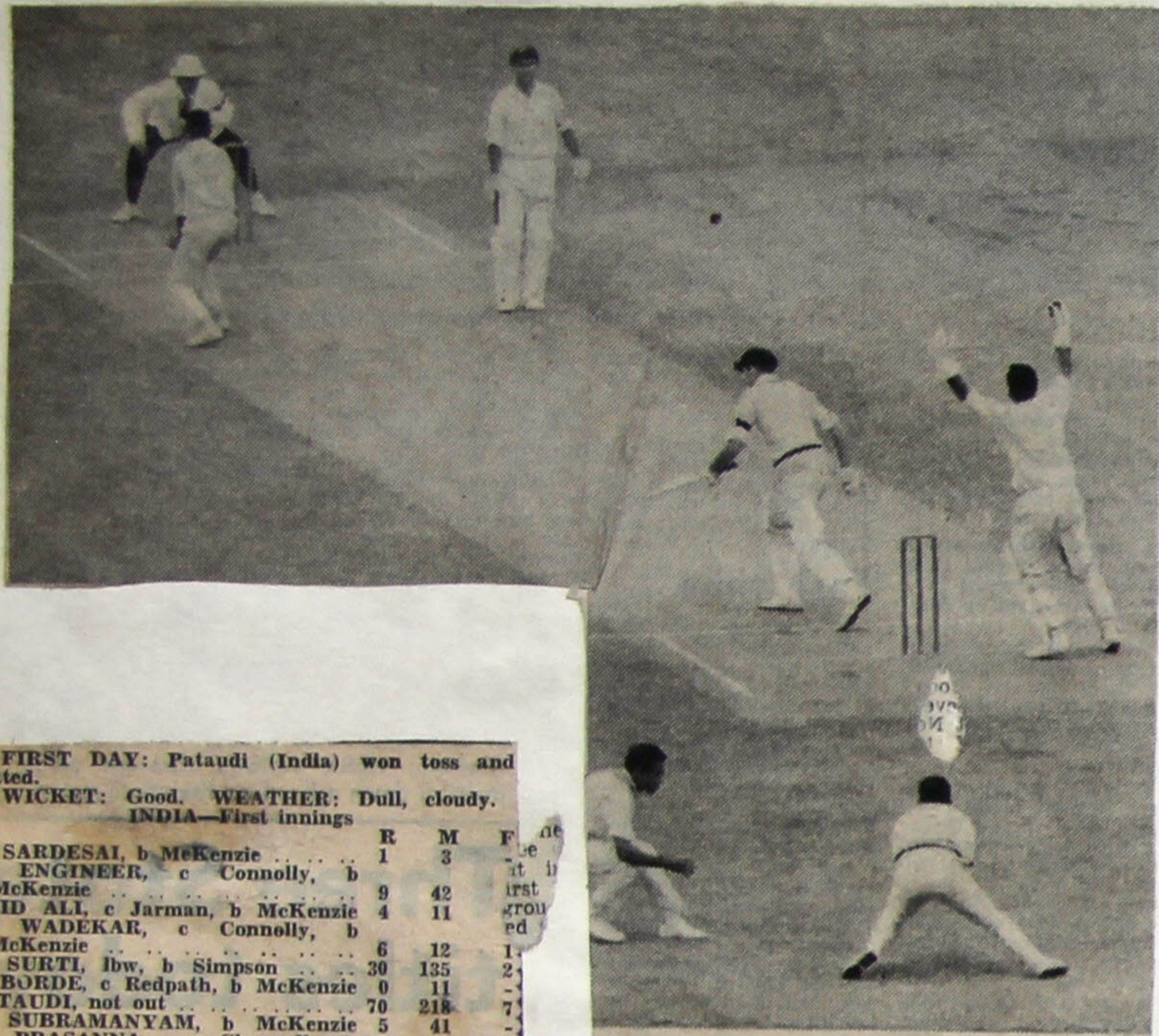

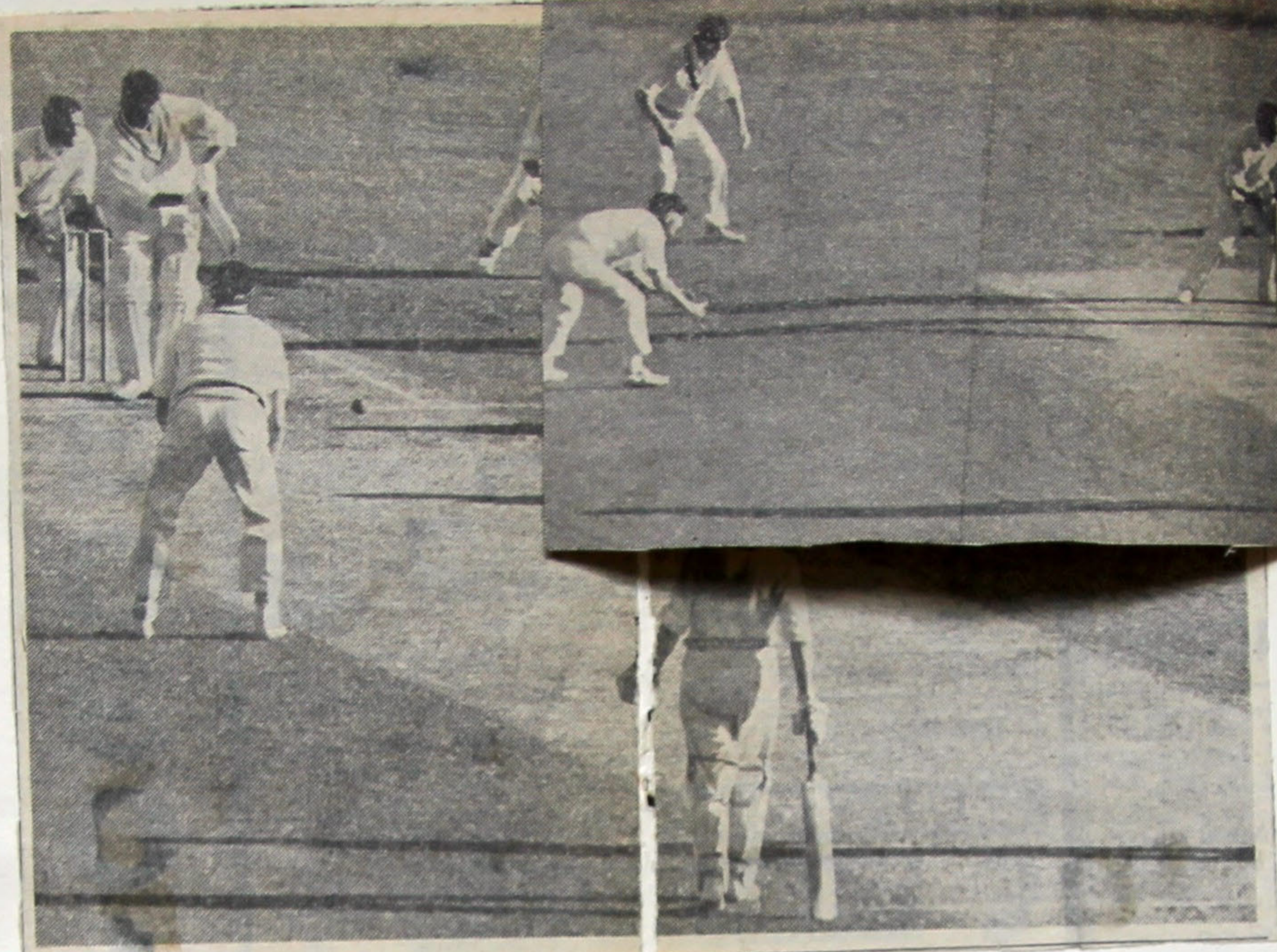

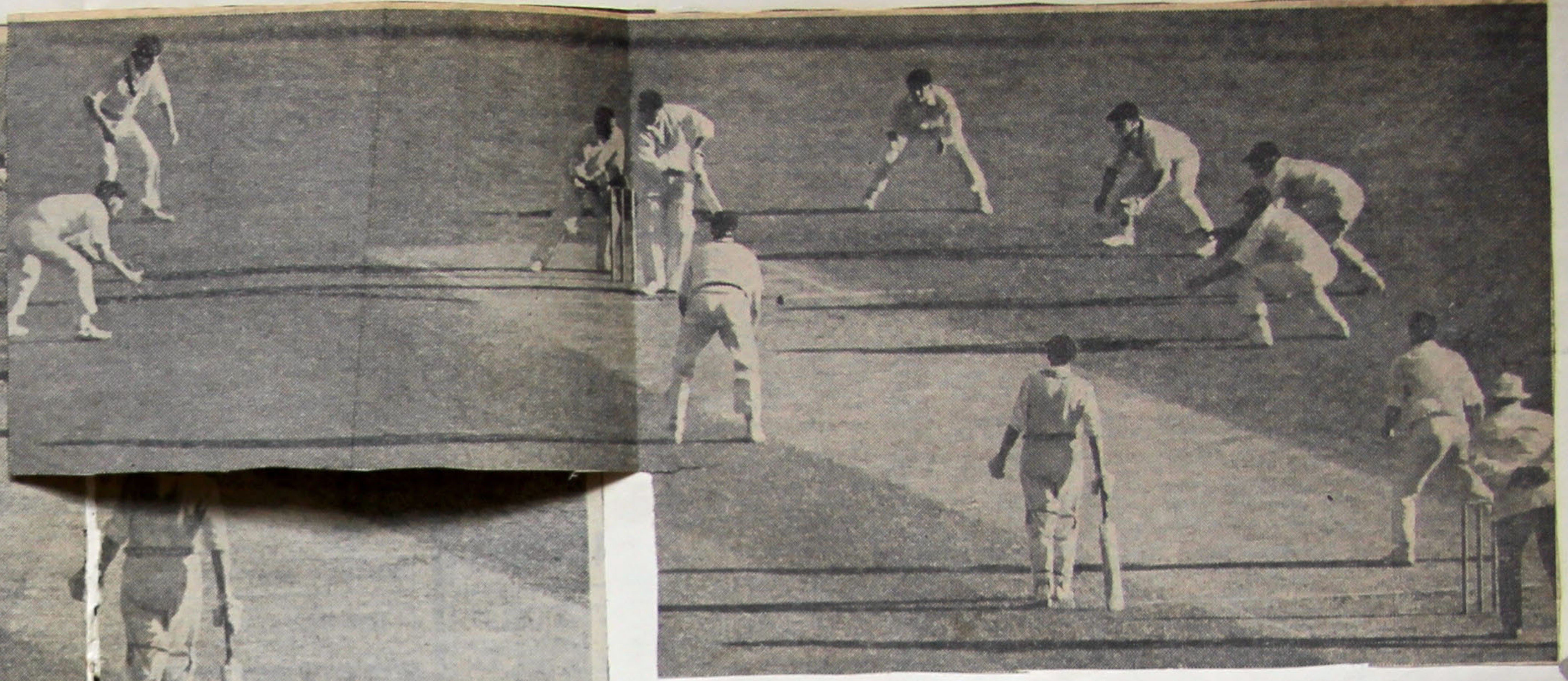




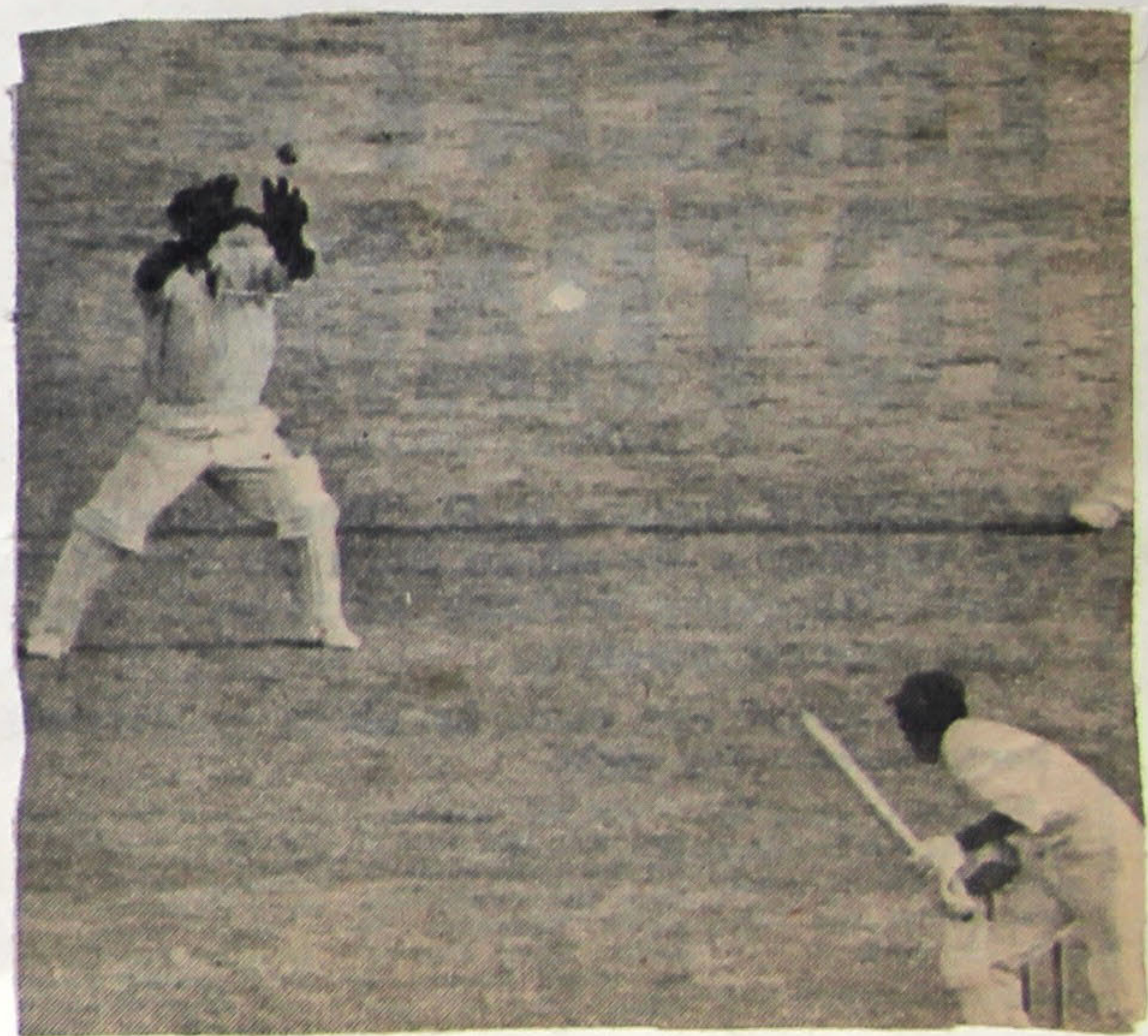

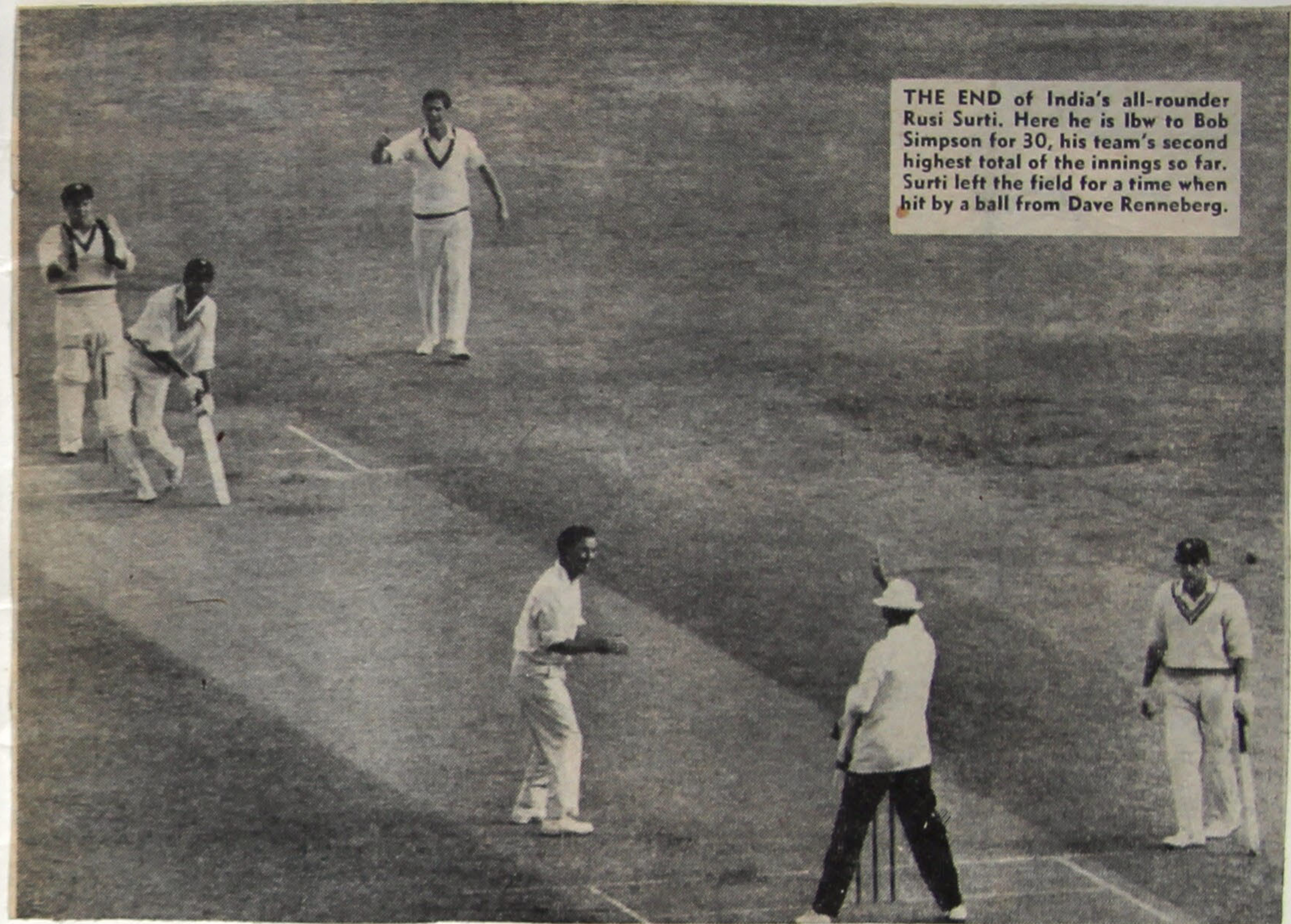
